City Accepts Tenders For Paving, Uniforms

Upwards of \$71,123.40 were awarded in tenders at a special meeting of the Charlottetown City Council yesterday.

The combined tender of Warren Maritimes Ltd., was accepted for paving or graveling

city streets \$55,777; paving parking areas; \$39,270; purchasing the city with 21 pairs of shoes for the police department \$13,850 per pair.

The tender of Douglas Brothers and Jones was accepted for the construction of cast basins, in the amount of \$11,964.

The tender of Adams was awarded the contract for supplying the city with 63 blue shirts for the police department at \$4.70 per shirt.

The contract for supplying the city with 21 pairs of shoes for the police department at \$13.95 per pair.

The tender of R.T. Holman Ltd. was awarded the contract for supplying the city with 21 white shirts for the police department at \$3.75 per shirt.

The tender for supplying the city with 19 pair jackets for the police department at a price of \$39.50 each was accepted from Hooper's Men's Wear.

The tender of Camac Construction Co. Ltd. for \$23,380 was accepted for supplying and completing fill for an interceptor sewer on Kirkwood Drive West.

The tender of Irving Oil Company Ltd. was accepted for asphaltic materials to be used in paving, priced at 17.4 cents per ton, f.o.b. railroad Charlottetown.

Speaking for the tender committee, Coun. Arthur Wright, said the tender bids on five department equipment were not accepted because they did not comply in detail. He said there was confusion as to the bid in regard to defining the detail of the bid. He stated the tenders were being reviewed in order to seek additional information from the suppliers.

The proposed name for the new school to replace old Queen Square School might be changed on the suggestion of St. Jean School, Dr. R. Gordon Lea, chairman of the School Board, intimated yesterday when he was asked the reasons for the choice. He said a name well supported by public opinion would be acceptable.

Considerable opposition to the proposed name has developed, most of it from former pupils who do not appreciate the French name, which was once also the name of this province, when it was held by France as Ile St. Jean.

Interviewed on the matter Dr. Lea said choice of a new name had presented difficulties, as many did not favor carrying the old name because it would lose significance with the school removed from Queen Square. At the same time, he stated, opposition was also seen to naming it simply Queen Street School.
