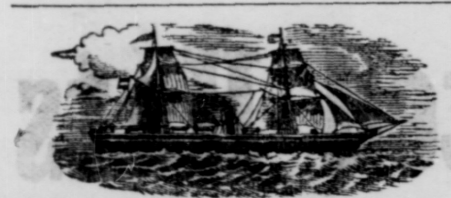

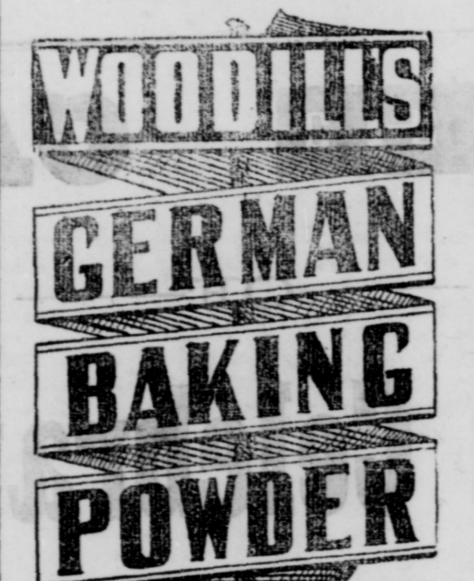

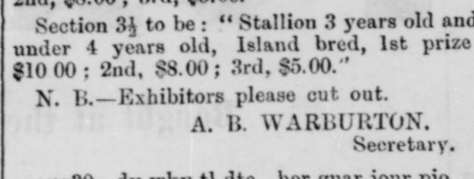

All exhibitors entering live stock on Wednesday, 24th September, must provide themselves with an Exhibition Ticket before they will be admitted to the grounds. Exhibitors of articles in the Drill Shed will enter by the rear gate on Fitzroy Street. Judges are requested to be on hand promptly. A first-class Dining Room and Refreshment Saloon will be on the grounds. Moderate prices will be charged.
