Is This The Liberal Platform?

We do not know what the Premier's program is for the future. But we do know where his Liberal candidate from Second Kings stands. There is no doubt about that — he has put his ideas down on paper for all to see, including the Premier.

First of all, the Liberal candidate has written a book. It is a good book and it is a sincere one. We do not agree with it — but the question is, do the electors of Kings?

For here are some of the things the Liberal candidate stands for:

1. The Liberal candidate writes, on page 306: "A three per cent 'educational sales tax' . . . would provide \$978,420 annually to carry out this program; a five per cent tax would provide \$1,630,000 a year. What a tremendous development could be carried out on this basis!" The writer adds that "it is doubtful if there would be much objection."

2. On page 316, the Liberal candidate writes that "There is great room for improvement in our own public works program." We hope the Premier agrees with this because we do. But we do not agree with this part of the Liberal candidate's program: "The increasing returns from the tourist industry, and increased fees on the registration of motor vehicles for a few years (motor vehicle fees could be doubled and yet not range as high as in Scandinavia) would enable a great expansion in our road program. Even a 100% increase in the cost of registration for our motor vehicles would, by providing better roads, be more than offset for the people by reducing unnecessary repair bills. . ."

3. The Liberal candidate is strongly in favour of farm workers' labour unions. On page 280, he writes, ". . . nothing would start our farmers operating on a more efficient and business-like basis than a good, strong Farm Workers' Union that would demand over-time pay for unnecessary late hours caused by mismanagement and lack of planning."

4. The Liberal candidate also believes that Kings County has too many provincial members. On page 271, he writes, "Kings County has about 21% of the total voters in the Province and is entitled therefore to six, or not more than seven representatives in the present Legislature of thirty seats." He then goes on to redistribute the entire provincial legislature and it is interesting to note that he has just about gerrymandered the Premier and his friend, Dr. Bonnell, right out of running room.

Well, that is where the Liberal candidate in Kings stands. That is his program for the future. We wonder how much of this is shared by his leader, the Premier.

As we said, it is a good book and the author is sincere in his views. He has a right to them — but where does he fit in the present Liberal picture?

We have been told by Mr. Mustard that the Conservatives have three leaders. Well, everyone knows that this Party has only one leader and only one platform. It appears now that the Liberals have at least two leaders — and nobody knows now how many platforms.

The united party is the Conservative party — it represents all the people. Give it your support.
