## Kensington High School Holds Closing Exercises

In addressing the graduates at Kensington High School closing exercises Friday evening, Mr. Malcolm MacKenzie, Assistant Director of Education, illustrated his advice to them by four well-known quotations: William Saroyan's great uncle said to him when he was graduating from high school, "Proceed, William, it is not impossible to walk on water." "These graduates could accomplish great things if they kept faithfully onward to their goals. Though Columbus faced the buffeting of adverse winds, the mutiny of his crew, and other discouragements when sailing to-

wards America, he wrote in his diary: "This day we sailed on." Cervantes, the great Spanish author, said: "The road is always better than the inn" meaning there are always greater heights to achieve, and one must not rest on one's laurels. To those students who might say "Why plan in such a world? Why go to college? We've lost the promise of tomorrow," Mr. MacKenzie quoted Saint Francis of Assisi, who on being asked what he would do if he were told he would die tonight, said: "I would finish hoeing my garden." We must continue with our duty

no matter how dark the future looks. In conclusion Mr. MacKenzie passed on to the students advice given to him as a graduate of Dalhousie University by Dr. Archibald MacMechan, Dr. MacMechan likened education to a star, and advised that the students follow the "gleam of the white star of learning."

## 675 Prince County Students Are Writing Prov. Exams

675 students from Prince County schools are industriously engaged this week in writing the Maritime Board examinations set for Grades 11 and 12 by the Atlantic Provinces Examining Board and the Provincial exams for Grade 10, which commenced Monday morning at five points throughout the county. In all, the examinations are being written at ten centres throughout the Province, namely Tignish, O'Leary, Summerside, Kensington, Kinkora, North Rustico, Charlottetown, Morell, Montague and Souris.

The breakdown by grades for the County shows that 401 Grade 10 students, 167 Grade 11 students and 107 Grade 12 students are writing the exams.

At Tignish, 32 pupils are writing Grade 10, 22 Grade 11 and 9 Grade 12. Mr. Edward MacPhail, Principal of the Provincial Vocational School, Charlottetown, is supervisor at the Dalton School where the exams are being written, assisted by W. W. Currie and Mrs. J. DesRoches. At O'Leary, 83 students are writing Grade 10, 25 Grade 11 and 12 Grade 12. Mr. Merritt Callaghan, Inspector of Schools for the County is supervisor, with Earl Jelly, Principal of the O'Leary School as assistant.
