Weather Favors Crops In Prairie Provinces

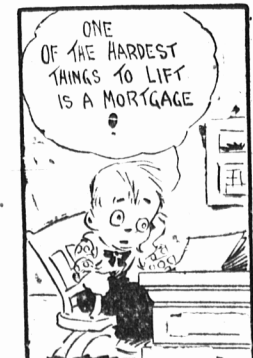
