

**NOUVELLES
ETRANGERES.**

L'escadre anglaise en Extrême-Orient, commandée par l'amiral Noël, arrivera à Saigon le 20 janvier.

M. Beau qui revient d'une tournée au Cambodge recevra l'amiral Noël.

M. Luce, résident supérieur titulaire de France au Cambodge, qui a accompagné M. Beau à Pnom-penh et Angkor, ne prendra possession effective de son poste qu'après.

A Sava, un ancien volcau vient de se réveiller produisant d'importants ravages dans la région. Un fleuve de lave d'une longueur de 4 kilomètres a complètement détruit les chemins de communication et les plantations. Le pont récemment construit est fortement menacé.

Partout des excavations et des souterrains ont été creusés, et des gaz chauds formés principalement de chlore mélangé au soufre, se dégagent continuellement. Les habitants commencent à évacuer les abords du volcan.

La Compagnie allemande des chemins de fer d'Anatolie vient d'acquiescer la majorité des actions des chemins de fer de la Mersina, du Tarsus et l'Adana. Son objectif est de faire de Mersina le point terminus du chemin de fer de Bagdad. Il en résulte que des deux lignes récemment contrôlées par les capitaux anglais en Turquie, seule la ligne de Smyrne à Aidin reste sous leur influence.

D. H. Vaugh, riche propriétaire de mines, dont la fortune excédait un million de dollars, oient de mourir à Albuquerque, N. H., victime de son extrême avarice.

Quoique Vaugh avait un revenu de \$30,000, il se privait des premières nécessités de la vie, et se contentait comme nourriture de noix et de pain. Il n'habitait cette ville que depuis quelques semaines, et s'était fait remarquer par son avarice et son amour de l'argent. Il était âgé de 73 ans.

On a officiellement annoncé, que le roi Edouard I et la reine Alexandra présideront à l'ouverture du

parlement, le 19 février.

Les membres de la chambre des communes se réuniront le 13 février pour élire leur "speaker". Le restant de la semaine sera consacré aux préliminaires et à la prestation de serment des nouveaux élus.

Ce n'est sans raison que la côte occidentale de l'île de Vancouver est connue par les marins comme la "Côte de la mort", car peu d'endroits, dans le monde entier, ont été le théâtre d'un si grand nombre de désastres maritimes.

Pendant les quarante dernières années, cinquante-six navires se sont perdus sur cette côte, et 711 personnes y ont trouvé la mort. Parmi les naufrages les plus néfastes furent la perte du vapeur Pacific, en 1875, qui coula avec 250 personnes; le vapeur Mout Serra en 1894, qui fit 30 victimes; le vapeur Keewanaah, qui sombra avec 31 personnes; et, enfin, le navire de guerre anglais Condor, qui coula en 1902 avec 80 personnes à bord.

Les plus récents désastres sont: la perte de la goélette Triumph en 1904, qui coûta la vie à 32 personnes; le vapeur Lamorna qui sombra dans la même année avec 26 personnes, et, enfin, la perte des navires King David et Pass-of-Mel-fort, au mois dernier, lorsque 33 personnes trouvèrent la mort dans les flots.

Cette terrible série est complétée par la perte du Valencia dont le nombre des victimes n'est pas encore connu.

Une sanglante bataille a eu lieu dans le quartier chinois, où se célébraient actuellement les fêtes du Jour de l'An. On sait, en effet, que l'année chinoise ne commence que vers la fin du mois de janvier.

Une des nombreuses sociétés secrètes chinoises avait organisé une réunion au coin de Mott et de Pell streets et un grand nombre de Chinois y assistaient. C'est à la sortie de cette réunion que les hommes jaunes ont commencé entre eux une fusillade des plus nourries, avec des revolvers de gros calibre.

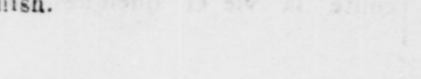
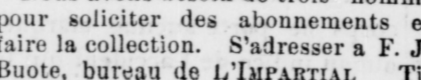
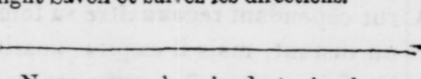
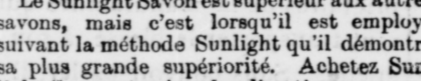
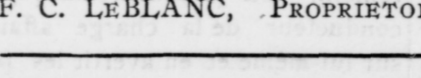
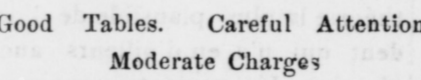
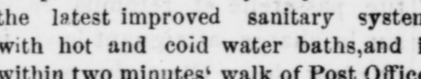
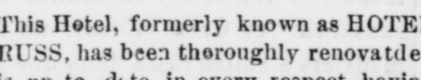
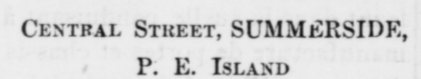
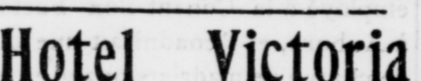
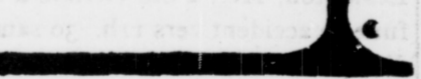
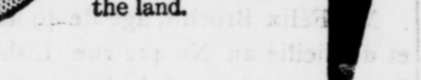
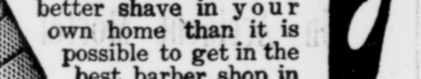
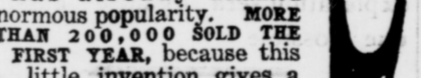
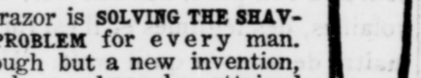
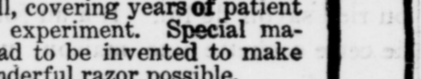
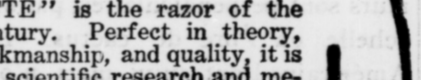
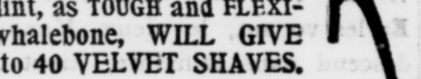
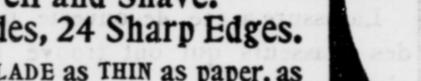
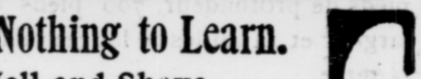
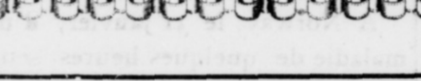
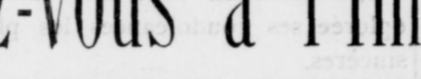
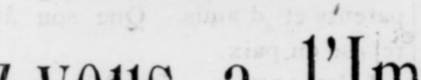
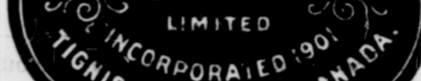
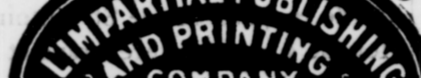
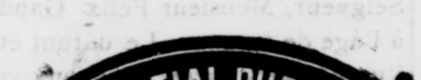
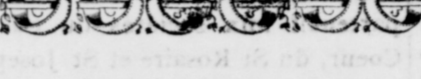
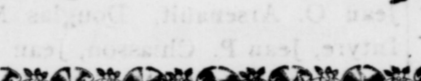
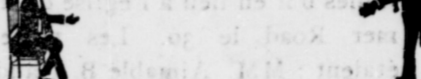
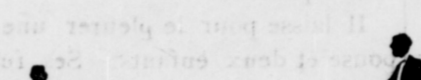
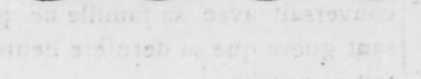
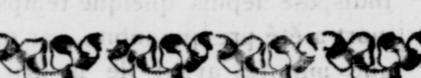

GRAND TRUNK RAILWAY SYSTEM

ELECTRIFICATION OF ST. CLAIR TUNNEL

The announcement has been given out by the Grand Trunk Railway System that arrangements have been made for the adoption of electric traction in the St. Clair Tunnel, the contract for which has been awarded to the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Company; the work to be started at once and brought to completion as quickly as possible. The system that will be adopted is known as the alternating current system with overhead conductors—the conductors in the interior of the tunnel being placed upon the walls, and in the railway yards they will be supported by steel bridges. The trains will be operated by alternating current locomotives, capable of hauling a passenger train on the grade at the rate of 20 to 25 miles an hour, and a freight train of 1000 tons at the rate of ten miles an hour. The interior of the tunnel and the yards on both the United States and Canada sides of the St. Clair River will be lighted by electricity from the power that will be generated in the extensive power house that it will be necessary to erect.

The length of the tunnel proper is 6,025 feet, and of the open portals or approaches, 503 feet additional, or more than two miles in all, one of the longest sub-marine tunnels in the world. It is a continuous iron tube, nineteen feet, ten inches in diameter, put together in sections as the work of boring proceeded, and finally bolted together. The total weight of the iron aggregating 56,000,000 pounds.

The work was commenced in September, 1888, and it was opened for freight traffic in October, 1891; a little more than three years being required for its completion. Passenger trains began running through it December 7, 1891. It cost \$2,700,000.
