

# CAMPUS BOOZING COMES UNDER SCRUTINY

DENVER, Colo. (CPS-CUP)-- Increased student alcohol consumption in the U.S. has caused various alcohol organizations to turn a more serious eye toward campus imbibers.

Data collected by the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA) indicates most college and university students use alcohol and that student drunkenness is a common problem at many campuses.

According to an article in Alcohol World by Dr. David Kraft of the University of Massachusetts, "college and university populations ... present certain problems for those seeking to establish

primary prevention of alcohol abuse. Social norms on campus seem to equate alcohol use with achievement of adult status in our society."

Kraft also noted widespread use of alcohol by faculty and staff groups "can reinforce indifference on many campuses about student drinking practices."

According to the Whole College Catalog About Drinking, a publication by the department of health, education and welfare (HEW), "getting the attention and participation of students will not be easy. They are not worried about alcoholism, nor with the long term effects of heavy drinking."

Compiled after intensive research across the country the catalog presents ideas and program concepts to deal with alcohol abuse prevention. It also noted that several universities have instituted programs aimed at educating campus boozers.

Indiana University has initiated a module program called "Booze and You's" which included a W.C. Fields cartoon giving basic information about alcohol, its uses, drinking patterns and effects.

A three-year old NIAAA grant kicked off a program at the University of Massachusetts using a number of

## Dope consumers: exercise caution

CHICAGO (ENS/CUP) -- Marijuana that has been fertilized with high nitrate-content fertilizers could possibly contain a cancer-causing substance. That's the concern being expressed to High Times magazine by Doctors Norman Farnsworth and Geoffrey Cordell of the University of Illinois Medical Center.

According to the two pharmacologists, some of the nitrates maybe reduced while the weed is still in the soil, or during storage or use. Conceivably, these nitrates could react with nitrogen contained in other basic alkaloids recently discovered in marijuana. Catalyzed with other substances found in hemp, the reaction could form N-Nitrosamine. N-nitrosamines are a know potent carcinogen formed in the stomach during digestion of meats or fish which have been preserved with nitrates or nitrites.



The researcher emphasize that this is all just



speculation so far, and there's no evidence yet that any pot contains nitrosamines. Nitrates, by the way, are one of three nutrients needed by all plants, so it would be impossible to grow pot without them. According to High Times, the nitrosamine problem might become of greater concern once marijuana is legalized and big manufacturers attempt to grow high-yield crops by over fertilization.
