

## Eight Witnesses Are Heard As Possession Case Opens

Eight Crown witnesses were heard yesterday at the trial of John Henry Reid of Charlottetown, charged with the possession of stolen goods knowing them to be stolen, opened in Queen's County Court before Judge C. St. Clair Trainor.

Reid is charged with the illegal possession of 245 bags of potatoes, valued at approximately \$245, the property of the Gulf Potato Company of North Wiltshire, P.E.I.

The accused pleaded not guilty to the charge. He is represented by Allison Gillis while J.P. Nicholson is crown prosecutor.

Two witnesses appeared at the morning sitting. RCMP Corporal Gordon R. Humphrey, in charge of the RCMP identification section, identified photos he had taken at the Gulf Potato's North Wiltshire warehouse and others he had taken at the city business establishment of the accused.

He also identified a number of other objects collected by the Crown which are used in packing potatoes.

Jerome O'Brien of Mount Edward Road, an official of the company, testified that in December of 1958 his company had a large quantity of potatoes stored in the North Wiltshire warehouse contained mostly in 75 or 100-pound jute bags.

The witness said the company did not sell 50-pound paper bags of potatoes on local markets. This type of bag he said was used for mainland shipments.

He said in the period December 24 approximately 900 50-pound bags were being prepared for shipment to the mainland.

The witness stated he first saw the RCMP in connection with the case after they had responded to his phone call Dec. 4. He said he requested police services after receiving a call from the company's warehouse manager.

Moving into the afternoon session six more witnesses were called to the stand by the crown.

The first was Douglas George Duberly of Brookfield, warehouse foreman for the Gulf Potato Company.

He stated that on the evening of Dec. 3 there were 900 50-pound paper bags of potatoes in the warehouse, which had been prepared for rail shipment. The door, he said, was not secured with a padlock, but by means of a metal bar through the hoop.

Returning to work at about 8.00 a.m. the next day the witness said that he found the small door to the warehouse open and the metal bar lying on the floor inside. A check of the stock later revealed that 247 of the 30-pound bags of potatoes were missing.

RCMP INFORMED After discovering the loss Mr. Docherty said that he telephoned to Mr. O'Brien at the offices of the company, who in turn informed the RCMP.

Witness told the court that at no time on Dec. 3 did he give anyone the authority to remove any of the stock from the warehouse.

The second witness of the afternoon Donald C. MacDonald, of Charlottetown, identified the photographs of the truck as the vehicle he drove at the time of the incident.

He told the court that he had picked up another man uptown, and they had gone to the shed on the Railway Wharf where some straw was placed in the floor of the truck box.

Later they went to Johnnie Reid's and from their they proceeded to North Wiltshire where 119 50-pound bags of potatoes were loaded by the witness and his companion into the truck, from the Gulf Potato Company warehouse.

Returning to Charlottetown the potatoes were unloaded into the collar, witness said that they were dumped out of the paper bags, and the bags put aside.

RECEIVED \$10 At that time the witness said that he had received \$10 from the accused.

Later that same night the witness said that he and two companions went back to Johnnie Reid's restaurant and then made another trip out to the warehouse in North Wiltshire, where another 125 50-pound bags were loaded in the truck.

On returning to the city witness said that this second load was unloaded into the basement of the accused's restaurant and the empty bags were put back on the truck and taken to the city dump. No money changed hands at that time, he said, but arrangements were made with the accused that payment would be made at a later date.

On cross-examination by Mr. Gillis, witness said that at the time he did not realize he was engaged in any illegal transaction. He said he had consumed a considerable amount of liquor from 3.00 p.m. onward.

VOICED DENIAL As a result MacDonald said he had a good idea of where he was but didn't realize what was going on. He also stated that he never before knew there was a potato warehouse in that district.

To the suggestion that the potatoes were really taken to some other place and not to Reid's, the witness voiced a denial.

Eric Chester Jay, Charlottetown, CNR employee, stated that on the night in question he had seen a truck parked near Reid's unattended, but could not make any positive identification of the vehicle.

Elmer Richard, Charlottetown, who was employed by the accused until recently, testified that he worked as a cook, and that never on any occasion had the accused mentioned that they were out of potatoes.

## Highest Mark Is Awarded To Hillsboro Choral Club

Scoring 89, in Class 25, men's chorus, rural, union, the Hillsboro Choral Club of Mount Herbert earned the highest mark awarded thus far in the Charlottetown vocal and instrumental section of the current Prince Edward Island festival of music.

Second highest individual award went to the piano duet team of Margaret MacIntyre and Eileen Grant of Charlottetown, who won Class 190 with a mark of 88.

Appearing at Prince of Wales College auditorium during the evening session, the seventh of the day, the all-male Hillsboro group directed by John Lea-Morgan of Charlottetown, received high praise from adjudicator Garfield Bender.

Mr. Bender observed that the group sang with a fine musical tone and feeling which indicated the excellence of the instruction they had received. The piano and violin accompaniment was particularly well done he noted.

IN VITED ABROAD Recalling that over 1,000 Canadian and American choral singers competed each year in his native city in Ontario Mr. Bender asserted that this Island group, if they could raise sufficient funds to attend would be a "great asset" to this annual international musical event.

Appearing in a second class adjudicated successfully, the same rural group was awarded 87 marks for "We Pray To Thee" by Palestrina-Kjos, followed by Stephen Foster's "Swanee River."

In the first competition, the Hillsboro Group sang the test piece "Canada, dear Land of

mine" by Marshall, and "Shenandoah", their own selection. With everything done just right, the performance of the Misses MacIntyre and Grant in Class 190, piano duet, restricted to those 16 years and under, was "a joy to hear", adjudicator Boris Roubakine said.

Mr. Roubakine also paid tribute to the performance of the team of Nancy Thompson and Diane Rodd who were second in the same class with a mark of 87.

**PROCLAIMED** The Hospitals Act, passed at the last session of the Legislature, to regulate hospitals, has been proclaimed in force from May 1, 1959. Regulations have been made under the Act providing that, amongst other things, "No aid shall be paid . . . to any hospital which refuses to admit any patient suffering from any acute illness or injury, on account of his indigent circumstances."

Also no aid under the Act may be paid for insured service under the Hospital and Diagnostic Services Insurance Act.
