### Contract Bridge

#### GOOD JUDGMENT NEEDED

South had a difficult decision in the following deal, but he should have landed on his feet.

South dealer.  
Both sides vulnerable.  
Rubber bridge.

South West North East

West's opening lead was the king of spades.

Winning with the blank ace, South led a trump to dummy's king, hoping that West would play the jack or queen and thus permit a finesse against East. When West produced the trump four, however, it was all to evident that East (as his double implied) had a sure trump trick, and the return lead to the trump ace established that fact.

Declarer led and passed the queen of clubs, hoping for luck in that quarter, but again he was disappointed, and now that a club and a trump had to be lost, it became vital for South to make the winning guess in the diamond suit. As he explained later, South did make every effort to weigh West's vulnerable overall against East's penalty double, to fix the probable

location of the diamond ace, but he came to an unfortunate conclusion. He decided that West, whose spade suit had been only fair, must have had the diamond ace on the side. So South led a diamond and, when West played low, went right up with dummy's king. That, needless to say, was not a good idea.

Granting that South was right in feeling that West's bid had been pretty weak if he lacked the diamond ace, the fact remains that South did not properly evaluate East's double against West's mere overcall at the one-level. A double in this sort of case carries the greater weight. South should have asked himself whether East would have risked an opening redouble if he had held nothing in spades, a heart holding which might not produce a trick (if the ace and king lay over him), the king of clubs, and nothing higher than the queen of diamonds.

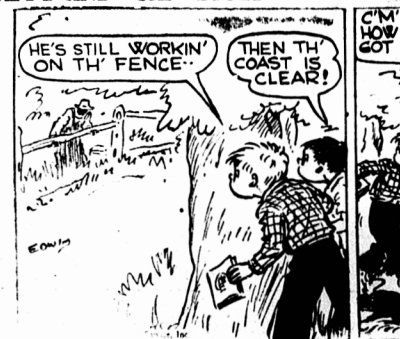

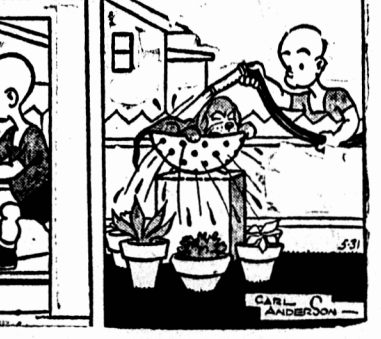
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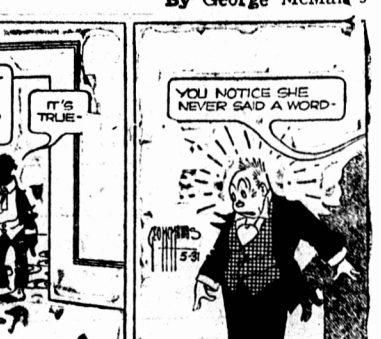
