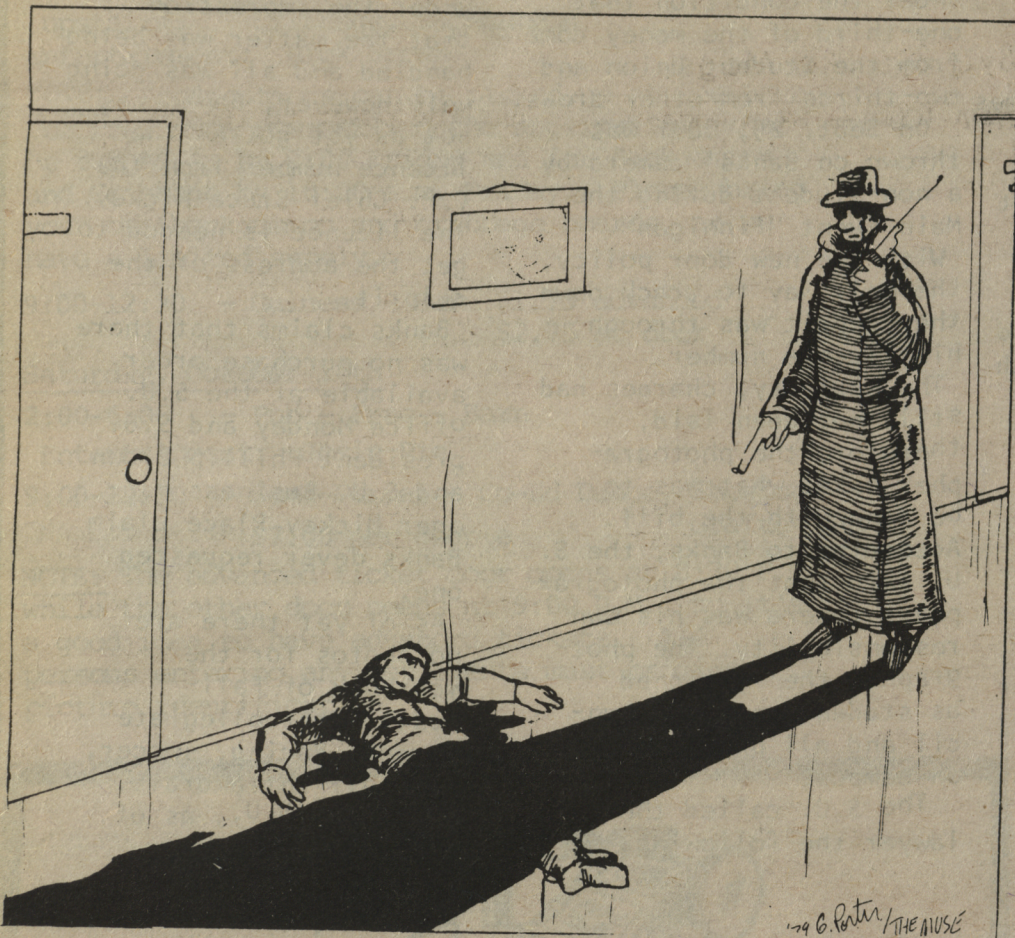
Memorial Students

 On Tuesday Oct. 21st, Students at Memorial University removed a Four day blockade after the Provincial government agreed to improve pedestrian safety. The four-lane Prince Philip Parkway had been blocked since Friday night, shortly after a 20 year old student was struck and killed at a crosswalk by a dump truck. Students have been demanding overhead passes for five years. Three other students have

been struck and injured by cars this school year. The demonstration of as many as 4,000 students ended when the government agreed to construct two pedestrian overpasses and install an extra set of traffic lights. Until this action is taken, the speed limit in the university area will be reduced and strictly enforced by police. Students ended their protest with a victory march on the sidewalks around campus.

- *1 - The 7,000 Bank Overdraft is basically what it costs the S.U. to operate in the off-season e.g. salaries of staff - repairs.
- *2 - Any clubs or societies who sponsor pubs receive 22-1/2% of all bar sales.
