**Remi Paul Says He's Quitting Federal Field**

LOUISVILLE, Que. (CP)—Remi Paul, a Quebec MP who left the Progressive Conservative party last February to become an independent, has announced he is leaving federal politics.

Mr. Paul, who has represented Berthier, Maskinonge-Delaunaudiere since 1958, said: "I want to be logical with myself. I realize it is not normal to be in politics alone. You have to work with a party, and it is impossible for me to be in the Conservative party."

But he added that he is not ruling out any eventual participation in Quebec provincial politics or the municipal politics of his native Louisville, 65 miles northeast of Montreal.

Mr. Paul, 44, left the Tories to become independent Feb. 16, almost two months before Leon Balcer, who had been regarded as the leader of the Quebec Conservative MPs. Both expressed extreme dissatisfaction with the party leadership of John Diefenbaker.

BALCER RETIRES  
Mr. Balcer announced Wednesday that he was withdrawing from federal politics. He became an independent April 7.

Mr. Paul, in making his withdrawal known, refrained from any new attacks on Mr. Diefenbaker. He said at the time of his departure from the Tory ranks: "Not only would I be defeated as a Conservative candidate (at the next election) under Mr. Diefenbaker, I would lose my deposit."

The next election is set for Nov. 8.
