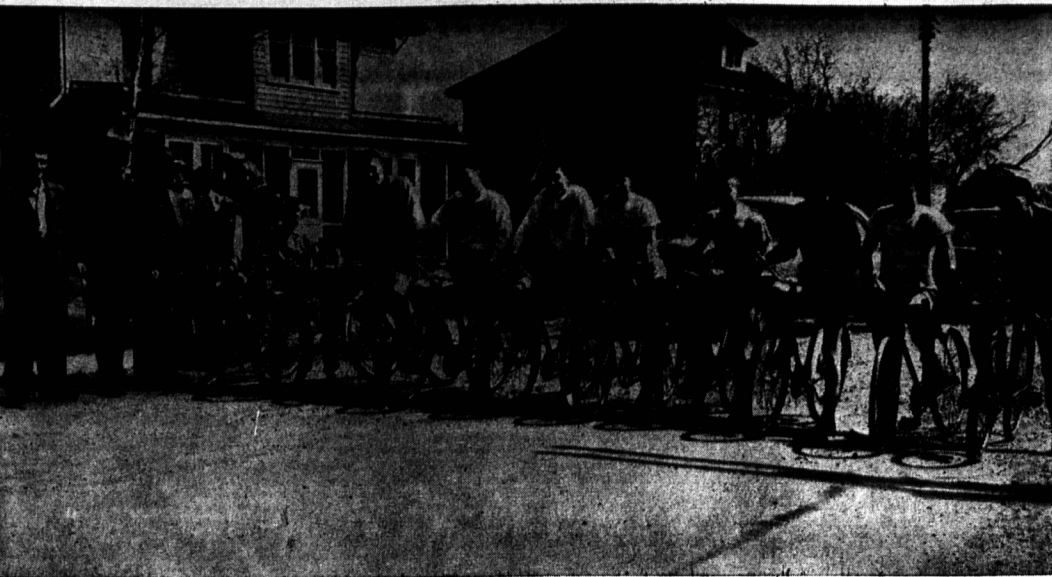


Windsor Arsenault Wins S'ide Ten-Mile Bike Race
