Flag Decision Is Regretted

LETHBRIDGE, Alta. (CP)—James Baxter of Lethbridge Dominion second vice-president of the Army, Navy, Air Force Veterans in Canada, expressed regret Prime Minister Pearson has decided to replace the Red Ensign with a flag containing three maple leaves.

Mr. Baxter recalled that at the Dominion convention of the ANAF in Winnipeg in 1962 the association passed a resolution adopting the Red Ensign as its official flag.

Settlement In Air Death Said Record

NEW YORK (AP)—A judge has approved an award of \$648,000 plus interest to the wife of a chemist killed in an airplane collision over New York City on Dec. 16, 1960.

The settlement was the largest single amount ever in a death case, said William F. X. Goughan, counsel for the wife, Edna Kamlet.

Her husband, Dr. Jones Kamlet, one of 134 persons killed in the accident, was credited with developing a tablet for diabetic diagnosis. He was 46 and had a consulting firm.

Under terms of the settlement, approved by State Supreme Court Justice Henry Clay Greenberg, United Air Lines would pay \$402,118; Trans World Airlines \$98,891, and the U.S. government \$144,000.

The lines operated the planes involved in the collision.

Some 60 other cases resulting from the collision have been settled without trial for a total awards estimated at more than \$5,000,000.

Cigarettes Comeback Predicted

MONTREAL (CP)—Antonio Toledo, Jr., vice-president and director of marketing of Benson and Hedges Canadian Tobacco Ltd., said here the tobacco industry was "rocked sharply" by the report of the advisory committee to the surgeon general of the United States, which linked cigarette smoking and lung cancer.

However, he said cigarette consumption in Canada, set back almost 25 per cent in February this year, will recover to a rate exceeding that of 1963 by the end of the year.

Mr. Toledo, speaking to the National Association of Tobacco and Confectionery Distributors Convention, said the report was "only the most recent in a long line of attacks that began with King James in 1604."

Mining Veteran Buried Yesterday

VANCOUVER (CP)—Funeral services were held Friday for William B. Burnett, 94, who was known as the "grand old man" of B.C. mining.

For 35 years he headed Cariboo Gold Quartz Ltd., one of B.C.'s most successful gold mining properties.

He retired two years ago.

Told by some of the best mining men in the province there was little prospect for the property near Barkerville in the central interior, he never lost faith. The property after development paid out more than \$1,600,000 in dividends.

A native of Sussex, N.B., and a graduate of Acadia University he arrived in Vancouver in 1891. His first job was to help unload silk and tea from the Empress of India, the first of the old-time CPR Trans-Pacific Empress boats.
