Road Contracts For Repairing And Subgrading

An extensive programme of work is planned for this season by the Provincial Department of Public Works and Highways. Much of the work to be done has already been started. Among the contracts already given, are the following: Poole and Beer, repairs to Commercial road between Montague and Murray River; Matheson and MacMillan three mile stretch between Kensington and Summerside; Curran and Briggs, two miles between Summerside and Bedoue; and County Construction Co., is to start on Route 8 between Saunders Corner and North River Corner. Tenders have also been called for sub-grading of the following sections of highways: O'Leary towards Springfield, Poole's Corner to Georgetown, and sections of the Glasgow Road, Kingston road and Colville Road.
