Curator 'Thrilled' Over Gallery Grant

Montereff Williamson, curator of Confederation Centre art gallery, said yesterday he was "thrilled" over the news about a \$1,500 Canada Council grant for the gallery.

Mr. Williamson explained that the grant, plus the \$500 travel allowance that goes with it, is to be used for the purchase of paintings in other parts of Canada and that for the Charlottetown gallery, the paintings will likely be bought in Edmonton, Saskatoon, Vancouver and Victoria.

"I won't go for any of the really big name people," he said. "There are one or two in-

teresting young painters completely unknown in this part of the world."

"This is an imaginative operation," he said. "It puts the gallery directors right into the artist's studio."

Mr. Williamson said the matching grant that must be raised in order to qualify for the Canada Council grant need not come from provincial revenues, but galleries, the paintings may be raised in any manner by the gallery.

Canada Council also announced grants for galleries in Saint John, Hamilton, Regina and Saskatoon.

Youth Fitness Training Camp Is Underway At Holland Cove

A youth fitness and leadership training camp, which will also deal with a number of problems such as alcohol and tobacco problems, is underway at Holland Cove.

Attending the camp are 48 girls 15 years of age and older. Provincial physical education director David Boswell said this was the maximum number the camp could accommodate. "Some applicants had to be turned down, but those attending were selected on the basis of their leadership potential, scholastic aptitude and athletic proficiency."

Mr. Boswell said the camp is staffed by a competent group of instructors, including Summer-aside physical education instructor Charles Ballen, Queen Charlotte High School physical education instructor Mrs. Jean Sterns, QCHS instructor Bob Miller, Morell instructor Aquinas Ryan, physical education expert Patricia Pickard, gymnasium teacher Miss Jane Purdy, Moncton, and Mrs. Don McCa-

thy of Birchwood High School. The camp is sponsored by the provincial division of alcohol studies and physical education in co-operation with the federal fitness and amateur sport directorate.

Mr. Boswell said it is hoped that a special fitness demonstration will be put on Thursday, attended by officials of the federal and provincial governments.

Baha'i Faith Lecture Held

Mrs. Terah Cowart-Smith of Greenville, N.C., noted Baha'i teacher and world traveler, spoke Monday night in the Lecture Theatre of the Confederation Centre, her topic being "What is The Baha'i Faith?"

The latest chapter of the Book of Genesis has been added," Mrs. Cowart-Smith said in part. "God's purpose for man has ever been for man to wor-

The theme for the New Age was to be, there is just one race of men—the human race. A new world patriotism is emerging for which we may become conscious agents, a world order that is based on Justice to all peoples."

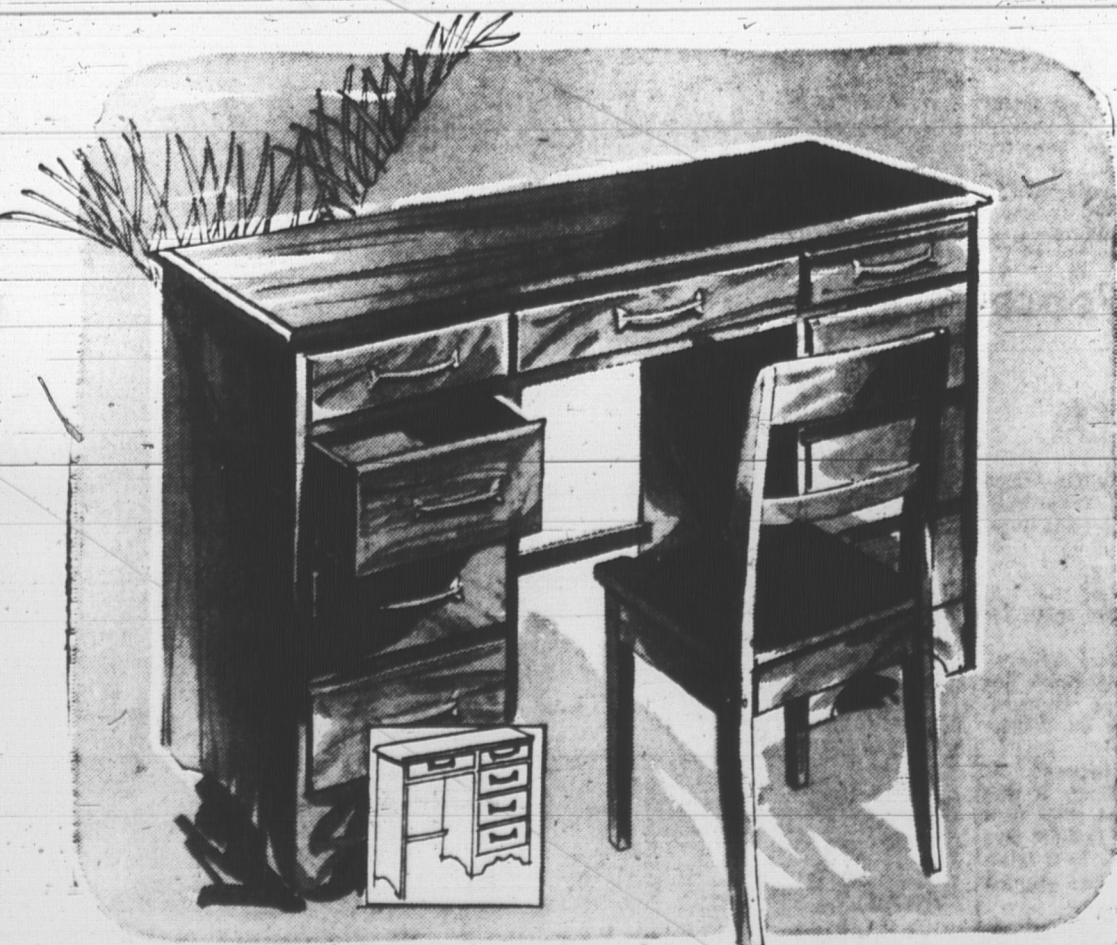
