Statistical Approach Made In Hunt For Cancer Cause

MONTREAL (CP) — A new statistical approach to finding the cause of cancer, its frequency when Parkinson's disease exists — has been reported to a meeting of L'Association des Medecins de Langue Francaise du Canada (Association of French Speaking Physicians of Canada).

Dr. Andre Barbeau, neurologist at the University of Montreal, and Jean-Gil Joly, a medical student, studied the records of Montreal's Hotel Dieu for 12 years starting in 1950. They concluded at the conference here that "cancer is considerably less frequent in the presence of Parkinson's disease" and is a disorder marked by involuntary tremors.

So far as it is known, this is the first time such a dissociation has been observed. An earlier study in London suggested that brain tumors are found in association with Parkinson's disease and for some years it had been recognized that there is a decreased secretion of certain bio-chemicals in Parkinson patients.

Dr. Barbeau suggested that further research is indicated in the bio-chemistry of Parkinson's disease because it appears that "cancers do not grow as easily in the Parkinson milieu."

EXAMINE 502 CASES
The study first examined the records of 502 cases of Parkinson's disease at Hotel Dieu and found only nine cases of cancer at various body sites.

Then a cross-check was undertaken of the 8,493 cases of tumors at all sites recorded in the tumor registry of the hospital during the same 12-year period. Again, there were only nine cases of Parkinson's disease with cancer.

At a plenary session, Prof. Jean Jamburger of Paris, of whom Mr. Kenny's findings have been described by the university as a "considerable step forward" in cancer research. He is a native of West Kildonan, near Winnipeg (CP Wirephoto)

Judo Seen Excellent In Providing Poise

TORONTO (CP)—In Japan, where it originated, judo still is considered a manly art and is taught to women.

But women who learn judo can acquire "a sense of poise that not even a charm school can provide," says Vern Fagan, a judo instructor in Toronto.

Women in Europe, the United States and Canada who study judo do so basically for self-defence and for physical exercise, but one of the most important things they gain is self-confidence, he said.

And this feeling of physical self-sufficiency can be valuable for city women who are constantly rushing on and off buses, up and down stairs and escalators, across busy streets.

"If they know how to break falls instinctively and properly, they are often protected against injury," says Mr. Fagan.

Co-ordination of mind and body is the ultimate in judo. "As well as the ability to execute a technique, it is necessary to be trained mentally to out-think and out-manoeuvre an opponent."

REMOVES TENSIONS
And judo, if practised regularly, encourages a healthy mental disposition as well as good physical well-being. "Because judo requires complete co-ordination of mind and body, a person is rid of all tension, emotion and frustration with 15 or 20 minutes of exercise."

Judo pupils are first taught how to fall and break the shock of the fall with their hands. "Slapping the mat sounds hard but there is a knack to it and it is soft and easy."

New Effort Is Announced To Attract Housing Money

OTTAWA (CP) — A further step in the government's effort to develop a secondary market

for mortgages, and thus attract more private investment money into housing, was announced here.

The government's housing agency will sell \$30,000,000 of its huge holdings of National Housing Act mortgages, auctioning off 15 blocks valued at between \$250,000 and \$500,000 each.

It will be the sixth such offering by Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation since the government's policy was announced in April, 1961. In the first four sales, a total \$96,000,000 in NHA mortgages were sold to investment, mortgage and trust companies.
