FOOTBALL.—A Halifax paper says: "There is some talk of a light change in the playing rules to be made this year. The rule was in force in England last season, but was never taken up here. The change is to kick the ball out of touch instead of throwing it out, as has formerly been the custom. Kicking the ball out has great advantages. It does away with all the mass play out from the touch line, which is so uninteresting both to the players and the spectators. The only condition in kicking the ball out is that the players have to be on side, and the ball can then be kicked in any direction and any distance that may be desired. The new rule should certainly be adopted."
