4 Team Hockey League Formed

WINDSOR, N. S. (CP)—A new four-team hockey circuit, the Nova Scotia Senior Hockey League, was formed here Sunday. Member clubs are Truro, Bridgewater, Kentville and Windsor. Play will begin Nov. 26 with Windsor at Bridgewater and Truro at Kentville.

The loop may have six teams. Wolfville and Dartmouth clubs were given a week in which to decide if they will enter.

Charles Patterson of Wolfville is president. Kentville, Wolfville and Windsor played in the Valley League last season and Truro in the Antigonish-Pictou-Colchester League. Both are now defunct.

U.N.B. Batters Wanderers 46-5

FREDERICTON (CP)—Powerful University of New Brunswick Red Bombers battered their way to the finals of the New Brunswick Canadian Rugby Football Union Saturday, swamping Saint John Wanderers 46-5.

Bombers will meet St. Thomas University Tommies here next Saturday in a sudden-death game for the provincial title.

Halfback Ian Watson paced the undefeated Bombers to their fourth straight win, scoring four touchdowns. Teammate Guy Dolron got two and Hugh Auger and Bob Irving one each.

Mike O'Connor and Johnny Benson each scored two converts. Saint John's only touchdown was scored in the dying minutes of the game on a pass from playing coach Pat Barry to Pete Beatty.

Canadians Edge Wings On Dickie Moore's Goal

MONTREAL (CP)—Dickie Moore's third-period goal gave Montreal Canadiens a 2-1 victory over Detroit Red Wings Saturday night in the first meeting of the two National Hockey League clubs this season.

Montreal's win in what turned out to be a close checking game widened Canadians' first-place margin to three points over New York, Boston and Chicago, deadlocked for second.

Goals by Bert Olmstead and Ted Lindsay—a record-breaker for left-wingers by Lindsay—came in the second period. Until Moore flicked in his goal the home crowd of 13,802 was becoming apprehensive of a third consecutive setback for Canadians.

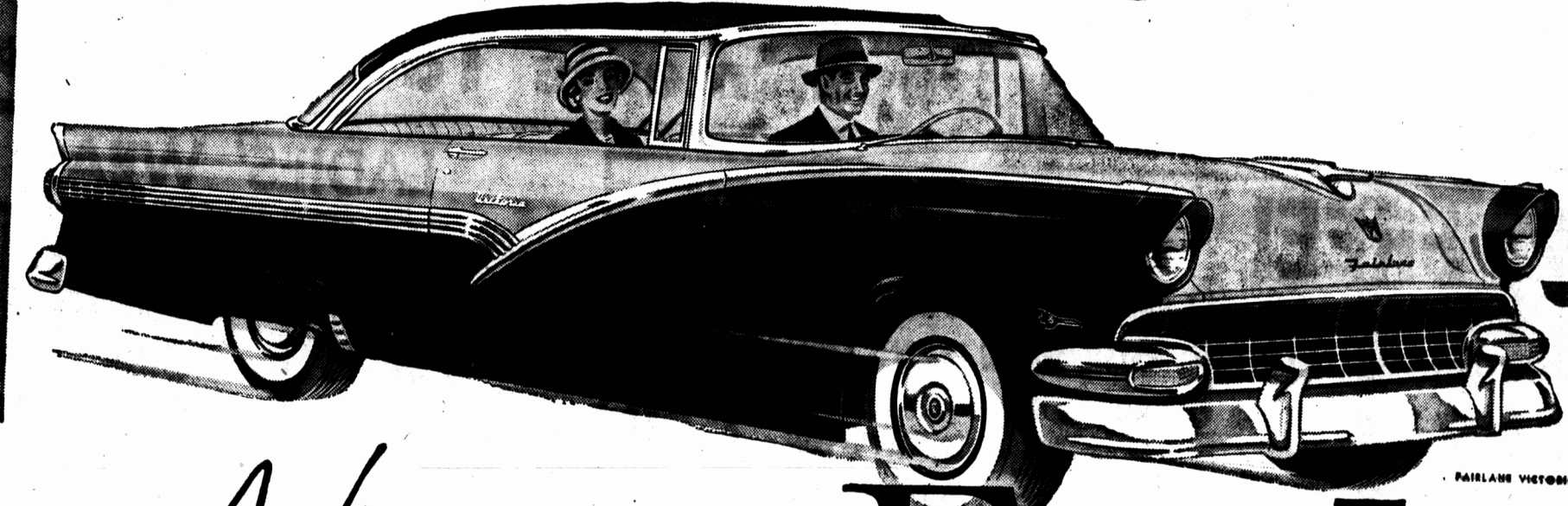
