Strange But True

Some Mexican birds nest in trees whose trunks are covered with vapors that form a protection from monkeys and raccoons.

The whale is the largest of all animals, and one whale can provide as much meat as a hundred steers.

There are four united States in the Western Hemisphere, namely: the United States of America, the United Mexican States, the United States of Brazil, and the United States of Venezuela.

The Anasop of New Guinea, attribute all sickness, accidents and death to the evil use of charms.

They have no organized system of government, no chiefs to lead them, no judges to punish them. Yet they live in harmony. And strange but true, when any member of the tribe commits a crime, even if it be murder, they are at a loss to know what to do.

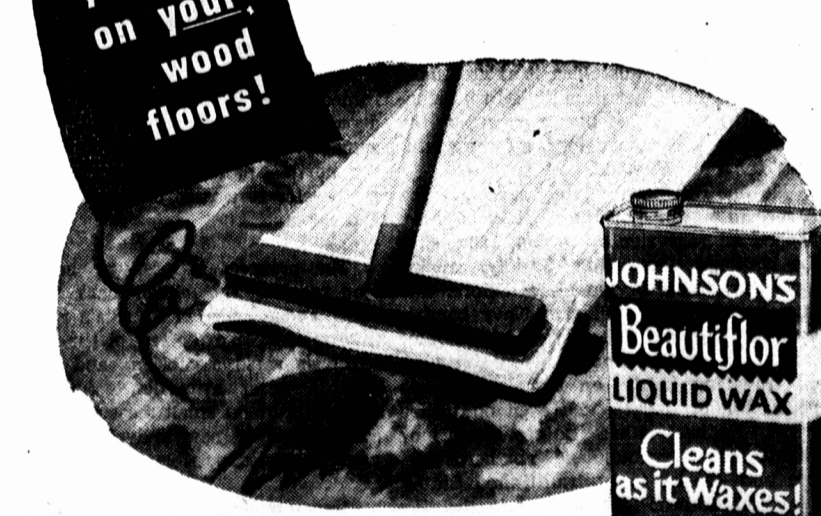
