

MP Asks Probe Of Gov't

OTTAWA (CP)—Conservative MP Robert Coates Tuesday called for establishment of a royal commission to investigate the extent of the infiltration of organized crime into the operations of the federal government.

The member for the Nova Scotia riding of Cumberland said appointment of such a commission was too much to expect of Prime Minister Pearson because Mr. Pearson had put his friends ahead of his country, Parliament and "everything."

Mr. Coates noted that on Feb. 20, 1964, he had asked Justice Minister Favreau for a statement on the extent of the operations of the Mafia crime syndicate in Canada. Mr. Favreau had declined to reply, he said.

Mr. Coates added that Liberal MP Guy Rouleau, then parliamentary secretary to Mr. Pearson, wouldn't have been anxious at all to have Mr. Favreau supply such information. Neither would have friends of the minister who were important people in the Liberal party.

Mr. Coates said a royal commission into crime should have far more powers than the inquiry headed by Chief Justice Frederic Dornon.

CRITICIZES PEARSON

When allegations of attempted bribery or political coercion had been levelled against four federal ministerial aides in the Lucien Rivard affair, Mr. Pearson had "fled from the Commons" on a "junker" to the West and had died down.

He said Mr. Pearson is described by his friends as timid, feeble and a "nice guy" who doesn't want to hurt his friends. "If these are his friends, who needs enemies?" Mr. Coates asked.

It would be a good thing for Canada and Parliament if Mr. Pearson were defeated at an election. The Liberals had done irreparable harm to Parliament.

MENTIONS RIVARD ESCAPE
Mr. Coates said it now is known how far organized crime has extended its operations in Canada and infiltrated into government.

One indication was the case with which Rivard, suspected in a political conspiracy, had walked out of jail and disappeared to make Canada an international joke.

Mr. Coates said a royal commission on crime should investigate specifically the federal justice and immigration departments.
