Illegal Hunter Fined \$10 By Kings Co. Magistrate

MONTAGUE BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN

Kings County Stipendiary Magistrate J.B. Johnston disposed of 12 cases in magistrate's court at Georgetown on Wednesday. Another case involving assault was adjourned for one week.

Lloyd Sherwood Gordon of Murray River pleaded not guilty to having the care and control of a motor vehicle while his ability was impaired by alcohol. He was represented by John P. Nicholson.

The evidence of two crown witnesses was heard and the accused was found guilty as charged and sentenced to pay a fine of \$75 and costs or 30 days.

Lawrence Louis Hendrickson of Fanning Brook entered a plea of guilty to unlawfully hunting migratory birds (wild ducks) in an area described in schedule "A" of the Migratory Birds Regulations when the season for said game was closed. He was fined \$10.

A resident of Georgetown Wilfred Edward McQuillan, pleaded guilty and was fined \$35 and costs for failing to stop at the scene of an accident with intent to escape civil or criminal liability.

Stanley Lloyd Ferguson of Montague was fined \$50 and costs after pleading guilty to a similar offence of hit and run. In this case, the accused was driving a large truck.

A Georgetown resident, Ernest Roache Jr., pleaded guilty to the theft of \$4.60 worth of groceries, the property of John Frank MacDonald of Georgetown. He was fined \$10 and costs and ordered to make restitution. He was represented by J.P. Nicholson.

Francis Stephen Murphy, Montague, failed to appear on a charge of assaulting Mrs. Kimball Jarvis by striking her in the abdomen with his fist. The informant gave evidence and the accused was fined \$20 and cost of \$16.30 to be paid out of the cash bail which had been posted by the accused.

A resident of Point Pleasant was fined \$20 and costs for being intoxicated in a public place. Two residents of Charlottetown were each fined \$20 and costs for having liquor in a place other than their residence. A residence of Abney and a

resident of Murray Harbor were each fined \$5 for having defective equipment on their motor vehicles.

A resident of Sturgeon was

fined \$10 and costs for driving without due care and attention. G.R. Foster, Crown prosecutor for Kings represented the Crown in all cases.

Island Holsteins Top Producers

Abegweit Firefly has finished third in her class a 365-day R.O.P. record on twice-a-day milking. Firefly produced 16,982 pounds of milk, 841 pounds butter fat for an average test of 4.95.

The test was the highest recorded by any cow listed in the current issue of the Holstein

Journal which covers production records of cows right across Canada.

Firefly is owned by the Estate of J. Walter Jones, Bunbury, Prince Edward Island.

Diamond Hill Texal Lady produced 14,566 pounds of milk, 588 pounds fat for an average test of 4.04 percent for Oswald J. Newson and Son of Kingston, as a four-year-old. The record was made on three-times-a-day milking.

OPERA IN CATHEDRAL
BOSTON (AP)—Ildebrando Pizzetti's two-act opera Assasino Nella Cattadrale, sponsored by Richard Cardinal Cushing, was presented Friday night in Boston's vast Holy Cross Cathedral before an audience of 2,200. It was the third time this work has been staged in a Roman Catholic Church and the first time in a cathedral in the United States. Pizzetti's opera is based on T. S. Eliot's poetic drama, Murder in the Cathedral.
