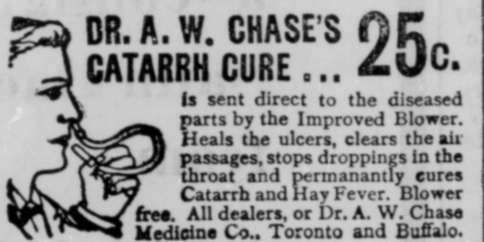

### LAUGH AT KRUGER.

A Hollander who is returning to Europe after fighting with the Boers says they are not worth assisting. Burgers are leaving, he says, for their homes in batches of tens and twenties, and those left are either loafing or carousing at Machadodorp. They are mostly Frenchmen, Germans, Hollanders and Irish who are now at the front.

Mr. Kruger, after visiting his burghers at Machadodorp, issued another proclamation exhorting the Boers to 'stand fast and fight well,' and to 'lure the enemy within rifle range and shoot him down.' In this way, he says, they will ultimately triumph, and retain their independence. The document asks 'help from the Lord,' then follows several Bible quotations.

It is reported that the burghers now receive these periodical religious manifestos with laughter. General Botha is said to have replied to it to the effect that the proclamation was unnecessary, and that the burghers would fight together. He boastfully asserts that he will not surrender like Cronje.

### THE EVER-YOUNG CHIEF.

Lord Roberts is daily displaying wonderful energy. He rises at day-break, examines and replies to all telegrams which have arrived over night. After breakfast he consults with the heads of the different departments while in the afternoon he is in the saddle, and sometimes covers enormous distances.

A characteristic anecdote of the commander-in-chief is at present going the round of the camps. While Sir Redvers Buller was here he accompanied Lord Roberts one afternoon on a ride to the western part of the town, where a small steeplechase course had been arranged for a weekly paper-chase.

Lord Roberts, turning to General Buller, said, 'Come, Buller, let us take the jumps?' 'Too old for that, sir,' replied Sir Redvers. Whereupon the commander-in-chief cantered forward and took all the jumps.

### LITTLE BOBS' REWARD.

The world's greatest figure just now is Lord Roberts, and the world is very much to be congratulated on having a leading figure of such exemplary and satisfying quality. He seems to be altogether admirable, good to look at, simple, gentle, modest and superlatively competent. Julian Ralph, who still seems able to make a pen go, however shaky his legs may be, finds in Robert the only feature of the war that it does him good to write about. He lauds him in the London Daily Mail with fluent and spontaneous enthusiasm, and betrays that affectionate respect which the field marshal seems to inspire in every one. of course, and unlike Grant he doesn't smoke tobacco. The newspapers are discussing what his reward will be when he finishes his work and comes home. One opinion is that he is too poor to be duke, and that parliament will not venture to vote him money enough to support the dignity of that rank, but that he will be made an earl and given a hundred thousand pounds and the blue ribbon of the garter.
