Davies makes pleasant reading, and "When We Began to Kick" will be eagerly perused by all the boys. To those who love Nature and flowers, the articles by Mr. Lawrence W. Watson and Mr. John McSwain will prove timely and attractive; and the remarkably clever poetical contributions by Messrs J. S. Clarke and Fred J. Nash will be appreciated and enjoyed. "Are Our City Councillors Hypnotized?" is not respectful to the powers that be; and until the sewerage pipes and connections are laid, the outlay upon the streets which the writer calls for would be premature. But the cleaning and improvement of Government Pond to which the writer devotes attention ought to be proceeded with at once. Upon the whole the May number of the Prince Edward Island Magazine deserves the people's patronage.
