Soccer Panthers Winners

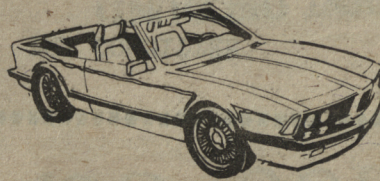
SOCCER SQUAD TROUNCES U.N.B.

The U.P.E.I. Soccer Panthers defeated the U.N.B. Red Shirts twice on the weekend and all but clinched the Western Division of the U.A.A. Soccer League. This meant that, barring any major losses by Panthers in their four last regular season games, they will host the A.U.A.A. Soccer Championships on the weekend of October 29 and 30.

On Saturday, the Soccer Panthers didn't follow their game plan but still beat the Red Shirts 1-0 when Steve Blenz scored on a penalty kick late in the game. The Panthers then made it a sweep when on Sunday they totally controlled play and beat the Red Shirts convincingly, 2-0 on goals by Don MacKenzie and Richard Berre-Gilles, Keeper J.F. Pinchaud recorded both shut-outs.

This Friday, the Panthers will be travelling to Wolfville to play winless Acadia. The Panthers will be looking to increase their goals scored as their average is less than two a game. Then on Sunday, the Panthers will play their last home game of the regular season as the University of Moncton will be visiting. Moncton is presently tied for second in the Western Division with U.N.B. U.P.E.I. will close out their regular season with two games in Newfoundland versus Memorial on October 22 and 23. The Panthers know not to take these games lightly and will have to keep up their outstanding play to insure that the Division title does not escape their grasps.

The game Sunday will be played at 3:00 p.m. at MacAdam Field.



TRAFFIC AND PARKING REGULATIONS

A. On December 13, 1983, the Board of Governors for the University of Prince Edward Island approved new "Traffic and Parking Regulations" for the University and these new regulations went into effect on January 1, 1983. These regulations outline the hours of accessibility to each parking area and restrictions pertaining thereto.

B. 1. In parking lots A,B,C,D,E, the parking regulations are unchanged and anyone having a valid University parking permit may use the parking spaces in these areas.

2. Reserved areas have been set aside for use during regular working hours. These parking areas have been assigned by the Traffic and Parking Committee and are reserved primarily for the Deans, Chairmen of academic departments, and some administrative personnel.

3. There will be reserved parking areas and spaces for the physically disabled and visitors.

4. The visitors' area in the large lot on the west side of campus will be available to faculty and staff and students on the same time basis accorded to visitors. (Please remember that the main purpose of these spaces is to provide easy access for visitors to campus).

5. The reserved parking areas will be identified by numbered posts and these parking spaces are to be used only by the persons to whom they are assigned. All parking spaces, excluding those reserved 24 hours each day, will be available to everyone outside the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

6. Those parking spaces reserved 24 hours each day will be clearly marked with appropriate signs and the parking spaces reserved for the physically handicapped will be identified by the accepted logo.

C. Physically disabled persons may receive special parking permission to park in designated areas provided they submit their requests in writing to the Director of Security who will bring them to the attention of the Traffic and Parking Committee. Anyone already having special parking permission, for medical or other reasons, must submit a new application as outlined in this paragraph.

D. Department heads can call the Security Department to reserve the small visitors' lot for meetings being attended by people off campus.

E. Copies of these regulations are available at the Security office in the Physical Plant building and at the Robertson Library. All members of the University community should make themselves familiar with these regulations.
