WHEREAS it is fitting that an opportunity should be afforded the people of this Province of Prince Edward Island properly to celebrate the occasion of the visit of Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh in this Province:

NOW KNOW YE that we, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council for Prince Edward Island, do by this Our Proclamation, order and declare Thursday, the thirtieth day of July, A.D. one thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, to be a public holiday throughout this Province, of which all persons concerned are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF we have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Prince Edward Island to be hereunto affixed.

At our Government House, in our City of Charlottetown, this second day of July, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine and in the eighth year of our Reign.
