# Martin Denies France Asked To Pay For Bases Transfer

OTTAWA (CP)—External Affairs Minister Martin has denied Paris reports that NATO has decided to ask France to bear the transfer costs of alliance bases.

Neither had 14 NATO members decided to deny France information collected by the alliance's radar warning and control system, Mr. Martin told a reporter.

All such matters remain to be negotiated by the countries concerned, he said.

France has offered to negotiate with Canada the costs and other matters involved in the move.

STUDYING MATTER  
Defence Minister Hellyer told a reporter his department is studying the whole matter but no figures are yet available.

The annual operation costs of the two Canadian bases are approximately \$28,000,000, including military and civilian pay and allowances.

Savings are expected to be made in shifting personnel and equipment from the two installations to Canadian bases in West Germany. But Mr. Hellyer said it is too early to tell how big the savings will be.

It is expected that Canada will vacate the two French bases by about this time next year.

## Metal Cylinder Suspected Hoax

KELKEE, Ireland (AP)—A U.S. Navy officer investigating a metal cylinder washed up on the west shore of Ireland has notified American naval headquarters in London that he thought someone was playing a hoax.

Police earlier had surmised that the three-foot cylinder was a relic of the American nuclear submarine *Thresher*, which foundered off the eastern U.S. coast with the loss of 129 lives three years ago. It was the greatest submarine disaster ever recorded.

The three students are charged with publishing material intended for adolescents liable "to offend their moral sentiments or to constitute incitement to moral corruption."

The principal of their co-educational high school, Daniel Mattalia, also is on trial.

## CONTRACT BRIDGE

You have the following hand, both sides vulnerable:

♠A74 ♥KJ83 ♦7 ♣AQ982

1. Your left-hand opponent bids One Notrump (16 to 18 points), your partner passes, and your right-hand opponent bids Two Diamonds. What would you bid now?

2. You bid One Club and your partner responds One Heart. What would you bid now?

3. You bid One Club, your left-hand opponent bids Three Diamonds, your partner bids Three Hearts, and your right-hand opponent passes. What would you bid now?

4. Your right-hand opponent bids One Diamond, which you double, and your partner responds One Heart. What would you bid now?

1. Double. Once it is granted that two diamonds is the standard sign-off bid showing 0 to 7 high-card points and requesting the opening bidder to pass, a double for takeout is obviously best. Of course there is an element of risk in doubling two diamonds, but even so, the fact remains that it is more risky to pass.

2. You can't hitnely let the opponents walk off with a part score—which they seem likely to make—when there is a good chance that your side can also
