A YOUNG MAN, private in H. M. Marines, who has done duty as letter carrier for H. M. S. "Bellerophon" for some time past, has disappeared, and, strange to relate, some \$40 or \$50 have disappeared with him. He was seen on board the "Carroll," Saturday night by a city policeman.
