TORONTO (CP) — The steel fabricating business is only on the verge of emerging from the recession, says the annual report of Toronto Iron Works Ltd. The industry, the report comments, is largely dependent on new construction in the industrial field, and while the last year had seen a good upturn in business in consumer lines and in housing, industrial construction in 1958 was down 38 per cent compared with 1957. The situation had been made more acute by considerable expansion in the industry's productive capacity, "coupled with price
