Unlocked Doors Invite Thieves

Two Summerside homes were victims of during the past few nights when a number of items were stolen along with a sizeable amount of cash.
On Monday night the residence of Neil MacFarlane, Cedar Street was entered and a purse containing \$40 was stolen. The MacFarlane's were in bed at the time which is believed to have been around 11 o'clock.
On Tuesday evening a theft occurred at the home of George Clarke, Calhoun Street, while Mr. and Mrs. Clarke were away and several items were taken. These included an electric razor, a ladies' wrist watch and a pair of men's shoes. The theft occurred sometime before 9.30 when the Clarke's returned home.
In both cases the theft entered the residence through an unlocked door.
The breaks are under investigation by Summerside Police.

22 Island Guides To Attend Jubilee Camps During 1960

In 1960, Canadian Girl Guides will be celebrating their Golden Jubilee. Some of their most exciting plans are for Jubilee Camps, which are to be held in every province across Canada. Two thirds of the expenses for these camps are to be paid for by a special fund, set up by the Dominion camp committee, to which Girl Guides from all over Canada have been contributing. Twenty-two Guides from P.E.I. will be representing this Province at these camps. The girls will be away for one month, from July 13 until August 13.
The P.E.I. provincial camp committee instituted a quota basis per county which included the Lone Guides. Prince County was allowed five candidates; Kings County — five; Queen's County, because of a larger Guide population, seven; Lone Guides—five. This is the first time that Lone Guides in P.E.I. have ever been screened for camping outside the province.

the boat relentlessly toward the rocks.
At 6:30 P.M. boats in the harbor heard Enslow's voice on the short-wave radio asking for help fast. Other fishermen braved the storm and set out to try to find the Ray-Ola-K.
About 8 o'clock Mrs. Enslow turned on her short-wave radio to listen for news. She heard of her husband's distress call.
"All the other boats were in," she said. "I thought he was a little late but you expect delay on a night like that. It was quite a shock."

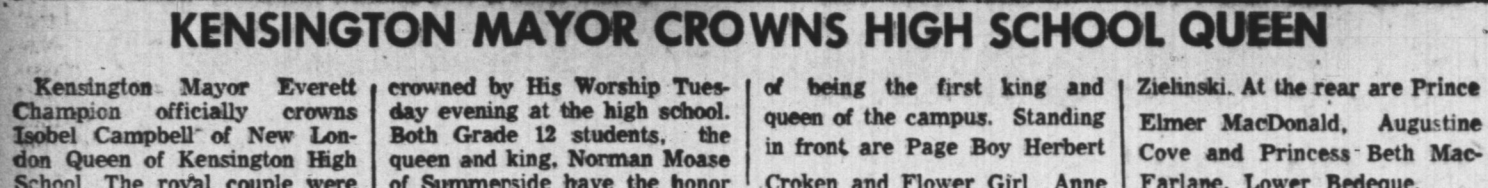
HALIFAX (CP) — The weather office says moderate to strong northwest winds are bringing very cold air into the district, and mostly clear but very cold weather is forecast for today. The outlook for Christmas Day is still rather uncertain, but indications are that it will begin with sunshine and end with snow.

Regional forecasts:
Mainland Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick: Clear with a few cloudy intervals; continuing very cold; northwest winds 15 becoming light by evening; low-high at Halifax, Yarmouth, Kentville, New Glasgow, Goshen and Charlottetown 15 and 20, Moncton 5 and 20, Fredericton and Saint John 5 and 15, Edmundston and Campbellton 5 below and 10 above.
Outlook for Christmas—increasing cloudiness followed by snow. Cape Breton: Sunny with a few cloudy intervals and very cold; northwest winds 20. Low-

high at Sydney 20 and 25.
Outlook for Christmas—increasing cloudiness.
Bay of Fundy: Northwest winds 15 becoming light in the afternoon; a few snowflurries; visibility 10 miles lowering in flurries to about three miles; colder.

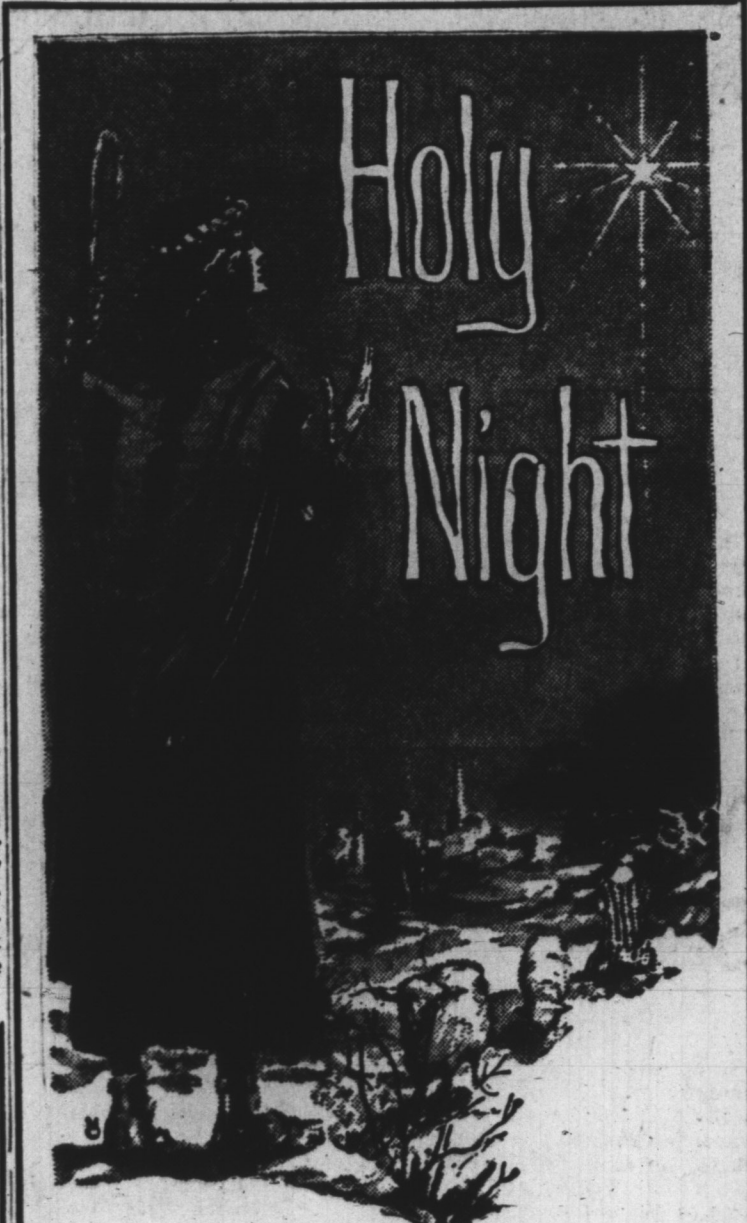
