

Hon. Dr. MacMillan Urges Spring Park And Parkdale Incorporate With Ch'town

"Parkdale and Spring Park should be incorporated with Charlottetown in order to alleviate the pressing problem of sanitation," it was stated last night in the Legislature by Dr. W. J. P. MacMillan who began his speech on the Draft Address.

"It is only through the goodness of Divine Providence that there has not been an outbreak of typhoid or dysentery as the result of the sanitary conditions in those two communities," said Dr. MacMillan.

"The Government has taken some steps to overcome this problem," he said, "but the major factors in the matter still exist."

"We have much less of this trash here in Prince Edward Island than we have in other places," he stated and he briefly mentioned conditions in several other Canadian cities where there are large sales of such reading material.
