Reform Program Said Working Well In Many Prisons

TORONTO (CP) — Major-General R. B. Gibson, federal commissioner of penitentiaries, Saturday criticized "the tendency to condemn all prisoners... merely because some are badly administered."

In an address prepared for delivery to the Canadian conference on social work he said that a third of all prisoners in Canadian penitentiaries are under 25 years of age. A constructive reform program was working so successfully that less than 20 per cent of those trained and released acquired a subsequent criminal record.

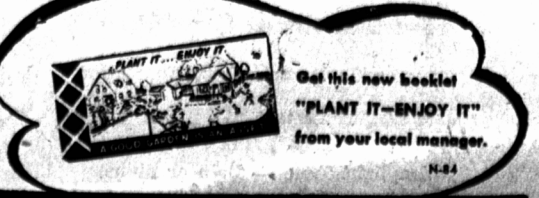

Every effort should be made to make the period of imprisonment constructive and purposeful. "I hope we shall see greater emphasis placed by our universities and other foundations on scientific research into the causes of crime and the methods of its treatment."

Dr. Walter N. Wallace, warden of Walkhill prison, Walkhill, N.Y., said the U.S. is greatly alarmed by the unprecedented increase in juvenile crime during the last decade. Various traffic sponsored by organized crime syndicates had succeeded in penetrating elementary, junior and senior high school classrooms.

Teachers are said to remain helpless in fear of their pupils, said Dr. Wallace. Dr. Wallace said that in the U.S. legal codes are a jumbled mess, methods of detection archaic and justice often unjust. He said the economically and socially favored often have a better position before the bar of justice than the poor.
