ELEPHANTS ARE KENYA PROBLEM

NAIROBI (Reuters)—Authorities worried about Kenya's expanding elephant population said here sterilization and not shooting may be the answer to the problem.
Elephant over-population is acute in southern Kenya's Tsavo National Park where experts say numbers will have to be cut to about one-third from the present 15,000.
The authorities had been considering shooting the surplus animals but researchers working on the problem with the aid of a \$200,000 Ford Foundation grant have come up with a kinder solution.
They believe sterilization might be effective in reducing the elephant numbers.
