CURRENCIES

MONTREAL (CP) — The U.S. dollar closed Thursday at a discount of 5 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, up 1-16. Pound sterling \$2.64 1/16, up 1-16. U.S. dollar bid 94 27-32; asked 94 1/4.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) — The stock market moved lower today amid slow trading.

Base metals led the decline, the third in the last four sessions. Their index lost more than 1 1/2 points as Hudson Bay declined 3 1/2 points to 60 1/2 and International Nickel lost 1 1/2 points at 91. Western oils were off more than 1/2 points on index and golds had an index loss of one-half point.

Besides Inco and Hudson Bay's losses, there were declines in fractional ground. Lower priced mines were generally easier but the range of losses was narrow. Most gains were held to 10 cents.

Western oils dipped at the close with senior issues losing fractions. Consolidated West Petc was off 4 1/2 cents at a new low of \$2.30. Canadian Williston lost 25 cents at a new low of \$2. Gains in most ranges were 15 cents.

Index changes: Golds off 5/8 to 78.57; base metals off 1.86 to 190.32; western oils off 1.31 to 125.94.

MONTREAL (CP) — The industrial trend was irregularly mixed at close of moderate trading Thursday on the stock markets.

In a lower base metals section, Hudson Bay lost 4 points at 61 while International Nickel dropped 1 1/2 to 91 and Bronze was down 1/2 at 29. In newsprints, Powell River gained 1/4 at 39 1/2 and Fraser firmed 1/4 at 26 1/2 while Brown slipped 1/4 to 16 1/2. Steels were better with Dosco gaining 1 1/4 at 29 1/2 and Dominion Foundries pushing up a point to 33.

Among constructions, Gypsum gained a point at 30 and Canada Cement moved ahead 1/4 to 28 1/2. Trans-Mountain added 2 points at 104 but Inter-Provincial Pipe lines lost a point at 52 1/2, and in the refining section International Petroleum dropped a point to 51 1/2 while Canadian Oil at 37 1/2 and BA at 24 were mixed in a 1/4 point range.

Shawinigan marked the biggest movement in utilities, losing 1 1/2 at 15 1/2, and in distilleries Canadian Breweries eased 1/2 at 25. Mines and oils were mixed. The exchanges' closing average show banks off 0.22 at 51.24, utilities off 0.1 at 151.1, industrials up 0.3 at 286.8, combined up 0.2 at 341.8, paper up 2.64 at 1215.4 and golds off 1.31 at 85.57.

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GRAIN

WINNIPEG (CP) — Considerable activity appeared in the Thursday on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. A general demand developed with reports of crop deterioration.

Among pivotal issues the losses ran from fractions to around 8 point on. A scattering of specialties and selected issues made respectable gains and there was a wide loss or two. News that business profits in 1937 have been running ahead of last year by 4.5 per cent had little effect on the list as a whole. Oils fared a bit better than the rest of the list early in the session but turned spotty later on.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks dropped 80 cents to \$184.30 with the industrials down \$1.20, the rails down 70 cents and the utilities down 20 cents.

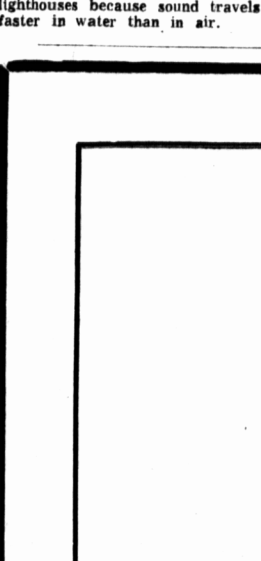
Canadian shares on the New York exchange were generally down. Hudson Bay Mining fell 4 1/4 on 1,300 shares. Also lower were International Nickel, off 1 on 3,200 McIntyre Porcupine off 1 on 100; Aluminum Ltd., off 1/4 on 5,000; Canadian Pacific, off 1/4 on 3,100; and Distillers - Seagrams and Dome Mines, each of 1/4. Walker-Gooderham was up 1/4 on 200.

Among Canadian shares on the American exchange, Shawinigan was down 1 on 5,000 and Jupiter Oils was down 1/4 on 7,600.

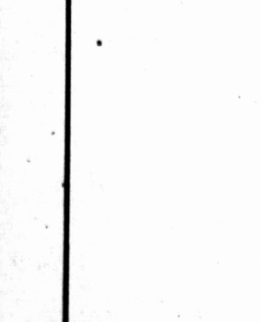
