**Phosphates can control troublesome onion maggot**

Organic phosphates rather than chlorinated insecticides such as aldrin, dieldrin and heptachlor are recommended by J. P. Perron, of the Canada department of agriculture's research laboratory, St. Jean, Que., for effective control of the onion maggot.

**Chrysanthemums can be successful in Maritime area**

Only a few varieties of garden chrysanthemums can be grown successfully in Canada's Maritime provinces. All the more reason for choosing carefully from those varieties recommended for a similar climate, notes G. S. Swain of the Canada department of agriculture research station at Kentville, N.S.

The research staff has simplified this situation. Seventy commercial varieties and 20 selected seedlings that should do well in the area - according to their descriptions in catalogues - have been tested in the last two years at Kentville. Recommendation of one superior variety from each of five general color classes have resulted from the tests: White Rice - white class; Cecelia-pink; Lipstick - red; Golden Carpet - yellow; and Elite Cushion - bronze.

**Island grain costs are high**

Because of the high prices of feed and the prospects of higher prices should the threatened grain shortage in the West develop this summer, many farmers and farm organizations have shown an increased interest in grain production on P.E.I. If accurate costs were kept, many farmers on P.E.I. would discover that their grain was probably costing them over \$1 per bushel to produce. In other cases where good farming practices were followed the cost would be down in the vicinity of 50 cents per bushel. Investigations in Ontario revealed that in the farms covered the average cost with a 20 bushel per acre oat crop was \$1.09 per bushel. When, through good seed, well cleaned and treated, properly fertilized and with weeds controlled, etc., they receive 78 bushels per acre, their cost went down to 52 cents per bushel. To make money on the farm, the farmer has to produce more bushels per acre and keep his cost of production as low as possible. This does not mean skimping on seed, fertilizer, etc., but using the best.

**New strawberry varieties show increase in profit**

New strawberry varieties can bring profits to commercial growers in Nova Scotia. But Dr. D. L. Craig of the Canada department of agriculture research station at Kentville feels growers have been slow to accept new varieties, even after lengthy and reliable testing by plant breeders. NOW ACCEPTED He points out that for many years Premier and Senator Dunlop were the standards of excellence in the Kentville area although scores of new varieties were offered during that time. The two old favorites now comprise less than 10 per cent of plantings.

Catskill, introduced to local growers about 20 years ago, has now climbed to acceptance with 15 per cent of 1961 plantings. It is a productive mid-season variety. Sparkle has achieved first place in only 10 years and represents 30 per cent of plantings. It has productivity and adaptability to soil types, and an attractive, well-flavored berry suitable for freezing.

Plantings of Redcoat, a variety developed at the Central Experimental Farm in Ottawa and introduced in 1957, increased from one to 17 per cent in a year. This variety resembles Sparkle in fruit and plant characteristics but matures at the same time as Dunlop. Redcoat and Sparkle make a good combination for extending the growing season.

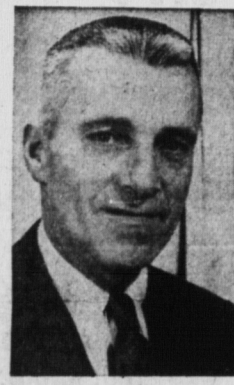
**PIONEER LINK**

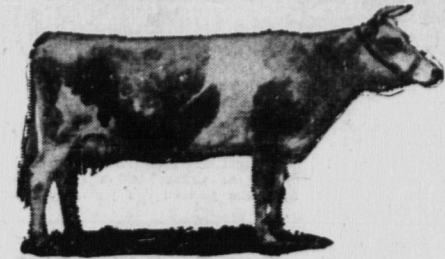

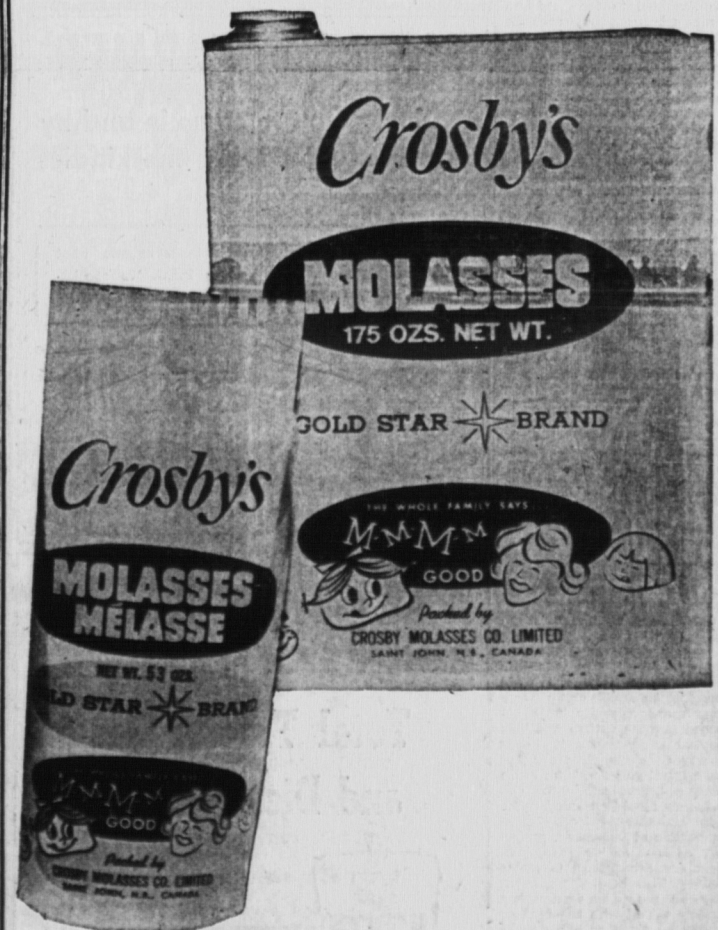
