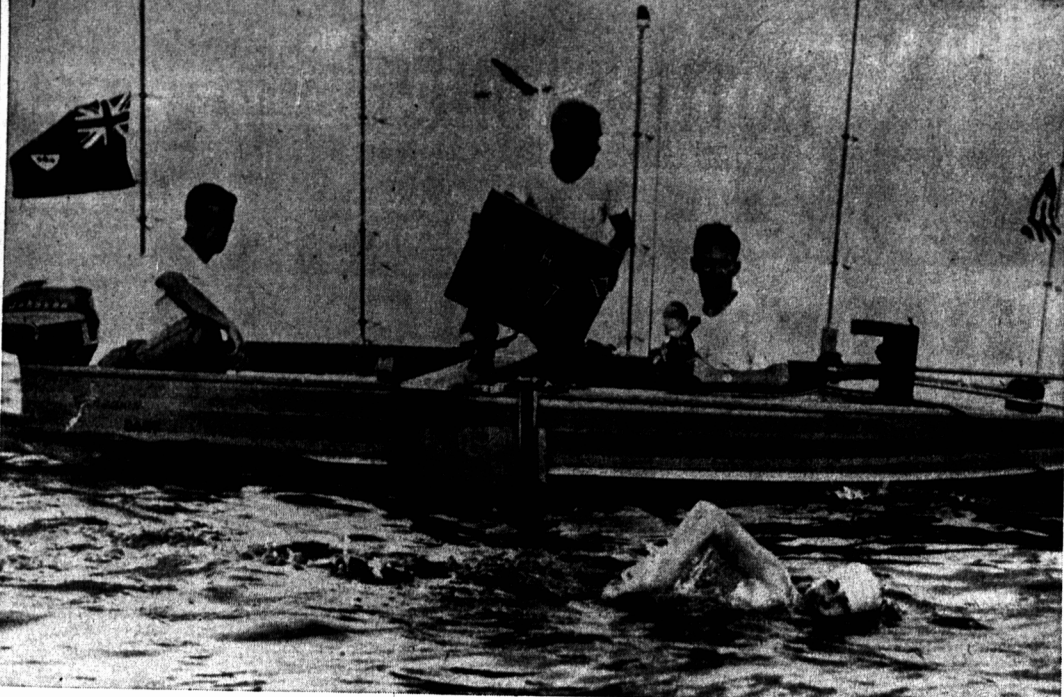

Couldn't Swim Against Waves, Shirley Declares

TORONTO (CP) - "I just couldn't swim against those waves," 19-year-old Shirley Campbell of Toronto and Fergus said Thursday a few hours after her attempt to swim Lake Ontario ended in failure and heartbreak. The end came in early-morning darkness less than two miles from the Toronto shoreline and 21 hours and 27 minutes after she had struck out from the mouth of the Niagara river in a surprise bid to beat Marilyn Bell's lake swim record of 20 hours and 56 minutes. The 115-pound typist was pulled from the water at 2:15 a.m. while 50,000 persons stood waiting for her to land near the Canadian National Exhibition grounds on Toronto's western waterfront. Her strength failed as she struggled with a vicious ground swell after coming within sight of her goal. "I just couldn't swim against those waves," said the attractive girl. "But I wish they hadn't taken me out. I still feel I could have made it."
