### VARSITY HOCKEY

Ed Hilton, returning to the coaching wars after an absence of two years, will send his basketball Panthers against the Alumni on Saturday, Oct. 30, at 8:00 P.M.

The Panthers this year feature speed and defence, augmenting a fast-break game which should provide exciting basketball for their legion supporters. Figuring prominently in their plans are Andy Packard and Brian "Big O" O'Shaughnessy, two rookies up from the States. Packard, from Presque Isle, Maine, should give the Panthers strength on the board and also has an excellent scoring touch from around the hoop. The Big O, from the Bronx, New York, is a hard-nosed defensive specialist, and an excellent outside shooter.
