LET'S EAT! Caramel Is Well-Known To French Homemakers

In the United States, I sometimes hear the word "caramel" used as a synonym for "chocolate".

Use from 1/2 tsp. to 1/4 tsp. according to the quantity to be color-seasoned. Add a very little at a time, tasting as you do this.

In making color-seasoning caramel, use dark brown sugar. In a heavy saucepan, combine 1 lb. dark brown sugar, 1/2 c. butter and 2 c. boiling water. Simmer until a deep, rich brown.

"Caramel is always made from granulated sugar, either beet or cane sugar. It makes no difference whether it is colored with coffee or caramelized to give it the rich taste we know as caramel."

When the sugar turns to a hazel nut brown color, add the amount of boiling hot water specified. Pour the boiling water into the saucepan using the side nearest you.

The syrup will harden. Simmer until it melts. Use at once to coat a pudding or custard mold, to flavor a custard, Bavarian cream or moussé, or to use as the basis for a caramel sauce.

Caramel meringue custard: In a good-sized heavy frying pan, melt 1/2 lb. butter. Add 1/2 c. boiling water. Boil until the caramel dissolves.

Then add 1 c. heated milk, 1/2 c. additional sugar, 1/4 tsp. salt and 1/4 tsp. pure vanilla extract. Stir-simmer until the caramel melts.

Beat 3 eggs, light stir into the caramel mixture. Pour into a greased baking dish or 8 custard cups that can go to table.

Place in a pan. Surround with boiling water. Bake 35 min. in a moderate oven, 350 degrees. Pour until the custard is firm in the centre.

Beat the egg whites light with 3 tsp. powdered sugar and 1/4 tsp. vanilla extract. Spread lightly on the custard.

Bake 15 min. longer at 325 degrees. Serve chilled.

Tomorrow's dinner: Cream of pea soup, chopped beef pan-fry, Mexican corn, green lima, caramel meringue custards, coffee-tea, milk.

Caramel color-seasoning for coloring and seasoning soups, stews, ragouts, casseroles and gravies.

Use from 1/2 tsp. to 1/4 tsp. according to the quantity to be color-seasoned. Add a very little at a time, tasting as you do this.

In making color-seasoning caramel, use dark brown sugar. In a heavy saucepan, combine 1 lb. dark brown sugar, 1/2 c. butter and 2 c. boiling water.

Simmer until a deep, rich brown. If it becomes too thick, spoon in a little hot water.

Cool, skim the fat, strain into a jar.
