Native Of Morell, Dies In Vancouver

*Word was received in Monton by J. J. Dunphy of the death Tuesday night in Vancouver, B. C., of his brother, Mark J. Dunphy. The information was contained in a telegram which followed a previous message advising him that his brother had been seriously injured in an accident. There were no further details.

The late Mr. Dunphy was born at Morell, P. E. I., and was in his 69th year. He had resided in British Columbia for the past 46 years and operated a contracting and building business there.

Surviving are three brothers, J. J. Dunphy of Moncton, retired superintendent of the C. N. R. Investigation Department, and Wilfred and Francis Dunphy, both of Morell, P. E. I. Funeral services were held Friday morning in Vancouver.

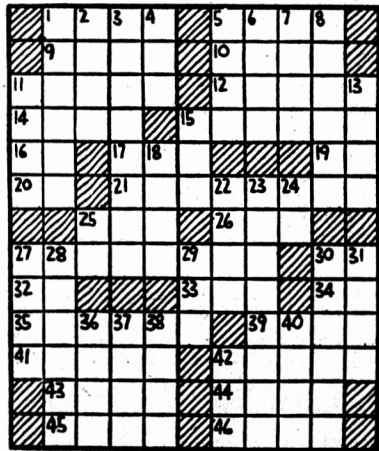
