Island Odds And Ends

From out of the West - Tignish way - comes word that big trout have been unusually plentiful in that section of the province, this past week or more.

More than one Charlottetown resident has returned from a business trip to Prince County, with stories about the big fish being caught at the very western tip of the Island.

The evidence it would appear, seems conclusive. Equally encouraging from the sportman standpoint, have been reports from Morell, Montague, East Lake and other points in King's County.

It would seem a plausible inference, that the mild Spring has played a part in coaxing trout into our rivers and streams earlier than usual. Nature seems to have forsaken its time-table, and to have advanced it's schedule a matter of weeks.

Apparently aware of this noticeable if temporary change, the trout seem to have fallen in line; how else can the number of large fish which have been caught be explained?

Even the Government seems to have taken heed of the speed-up because our time-honoured holiday, May 24th, falls this year on May 18th.

Prolonged negotiations of improvement to the Charlottetown Airport seem to have reached a climax. At any rate, certain maintenance work which has been carried on each year under the supervision of the Civil Aviation Branch of the Department of Transport, is being held in suspense.

This deferment of customary annual work is being interpreted as significant of a change in the control of the Port.

It has been noted by more than one citizen, that the paving job carried out on School Street by City employees is standing up re-

markably well. Unlike the main thoroughfare of the city, School Street had never been given much attention in the past, and had no great amount of subgrading before the application of a permanent surface.

Nevertheless, it has come through a second winter of service in better shape than some of the streets laid more recently; at least that is the opinion of many people.

Real progress is being made in repairing the broken pavement along the Charlottetown - Souris highway. Motorists have noted the day-to-day improvement with satisfaction. Most of the trouble spots still to be doctored are flagged, but a few have been overlooked by the men who place the warning markers. These overlooked ruts are giving untoward drivers many a nasty jar, and could be the cause of
