

# Yankees Beat White Sox; Red Sox Edge Athletics

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Lefty Curt Simmons beat Milwaukee Braves for the second straight time Friday night while Philadelphia Phillies collected 12 hits in rolling to an easy 6-1 victory.

The defeat was the fifth in six starts for the Braves who dropped a game and a half behind first place St. Louis in the National League race.

The batting star for the Phillies was first baseman Ed Bouchie who drove in five runs with a single and double, and by getting hit with a pitched ball.

NEW YORK (AP)—New York's second-place Yankees trimmed Chicago's American League lead to a half game Friday night, defeating the White Sox 4-2 after breaking a 1-1 tie with two runs in the fourth inning for their eighth consecutive victory.

A crowd of 31,947, largest in the majors this season, sat in as young Johnny Kucks and Bob Grim combined to hand the White Sox their eighth defeat in the last 13 games. Kucks, a 23-year-old righthander, gained his fourth victory in 10 decisions and his second over the Sox, who have dropped six of nine against the Yankees so far.

BOSTON (AP)—Jackie Jensen belted a two-run single and his ninth homer Friday night as he powered Boston Red Sox to a 4-3 victory over Kansas City.

Mickey Vernon also hit a home run for the winners.

ST. LOUIS (AP)—Von McDaniel, the amazing \$50,000 bonus pitcher of St. Louis Cardinals just a month out of high school, pitched like an old pro Friday night and shut out Brooklyn Dodgers on just two infield hits, 2-0, in a duel with Dodger rookie Danny McDevitt.

The 18-year-old righthander from Hollis, Okla., now has pitched 17 innings in the major leagues and has yet to be scored upon.

Thirteen of the zeroes were hung up against the defending champion Brooks.

The victory kept the Redbirds in first place in the National League.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Chuck Stobbs regained his old form Friday night and with abundant help at the plate from his teammates pitched Washington to a 6-3 victory over Cleveland for his first victory of the year.

Stobbs had lost 16 straight before the game—11 of them this year. His fortunes changed on a night when fans toted rabbits' feet and other good luck charms to their Griffith Stadium seats. The Washington front office passed out the tokens as a stunt to chase away Stobbs' losing spell.

Stobbs struck out eight and stayed out of serious trouble in all but three innings in which the Indians pushed across their runs.

BALTIMORE (AP)—Billy Gardner singled in the third run of a ninth inning Baltimore Orioles rally Friday night for a 6-5 victory over Detroit Tigers.

Gardner's single past third placed Hal Brown, running in place of Bob Hale who had pinch hit a single to drive in the two tying runs.

Hales' single knocked Detroit pitcher Jim Bunning out of the box and when Brown scored it was the first time that the Tiger hurler was beaten since April 22. Bunning had won six straight and now has two losses against seven victories.

CINCINNATI (AP)—Hank Foiles singled home two runs Friday night, including the winning marker in the 11th inning, helping Pittsburgh Pirates in a come-from-behind 3-2 victory over Cincinnati Reds.

The Pirates had to fend off a two-hit rally in the 11th before sealing the win.
