Christmas Is Loneliest Time Of Year For Arctic's People

EDMONTON (CP) — Christmas is the loneliest time of the year in the Arctic.

"You can't imagine what a lift it gives us just to have an airplane fly by at this time of year," radioed one outpost during the RCAF's annual Christmas airlift which ended Sunday.

Similar expressions of gratitude came from the other seven outposts — weather stations and RCMP posts — on top of the world as the twin-engine Flying Boxcar roared overhead with Christmas mail, supplies and Christmas trees.

These outposts likely will receive no more supplies until spring. Radio is their only connection with the outside.

WAIT FOR DAYS
The outposts wait for days for the airlift — which also parachutes perishable foods and books and magazines — to scattered points in the shadow of the North Pole. The airlift is a symbol of Christmas to the transport department and United States weather bureau personnel as well as the RCMP.

"It gives us a great deal of satisfaction to think that we helped to provide a merry Christmas to people so far removed

from civilization," said Fit. Lt. Bryce Chase, captain of the plane after completing the week-long operation in the Arctic darkness.

The Boxcar, which left nearby Nainoa last Monday, dropped a cargo of more than 10,000 pounds and covered more than 9,000 miles during the operation.

Personnel at the Arctic bases provided lighted targets to aid in the paratroops but, said Fit. Lt. Chase, "We got our biggest thrill when the words 'merry Christmas' burned near the target site at Griese Fiord," one of the outposts.

The northernmost drop was at Eureka, about 350 miles north of Resolute Bay.

The temperatures ranged from 20 to 30 below at Resolute Bay, about 1,500 miles northeast of Edmonton, and the winds reached 50 miles an hour, practically burying in snow many of the buildings at the station.
