**WORK ON WHARF** — The work of completing the Stevens Wharf at Montague began this week under contractor Henry Munroe of Montague. During the past two seasons the main wharf has been completely rebuilt, and there remains only to complete the dock which is presently underway. The old wharf, which

was built some years ago, was no longer considered safe owing to broken decking, and to the fact that it was almost floating since the piles were rotten and worm eaten. Last year all new 40-foot crossoled piles were driven, and these the present wharf was anchored solidly. The old crib work at the back of the wharf was also removed and a new cribbing placed. Crossoled stringers and walings complete the frame of the wharf which should last for many years. The decking consists of large joists set on the stringers, and on top of these is the main deck of plank. It is expected that the wharf will be completed early this summer, and will add considerably to the amount of wharfage space at Montague.

**FINE RECORDS REPORTED** — The March report of Holstein cows qualified in the Record of Performance includes the record of Bargee Suzy-Q owned by J.L. Dewar, New Perth. Suzy-Q at 8 years of age produced 19,252 pounds of milk containing 754 pounds of fat. Also reported are the twin daughters of Suzy-Q, Bargee Brunette and Bargee Blonde, they produced as two year olds in ten months 11,717 pounds of milk, 430 pounds of fat and 11,477 milk, 400 of fat respectively. A third daughter, Bargee Lady Astrid was reported in December with 14,506 milk, 572 of fat as a five year old. A full sister of Suzy-Q, Bargee Constant Hope, now owned by the Department of Agriculture has in the Falconwood herd made a record of 18,343 milk, 762 fat at four years of age.

**Was Well Known**  
Mr. Drew said Mr. Lunam was known for "notorious failure" to fulfill contracts including one in 1948 and that this should have been known to the department of public works when it considered his tenders. Mr. Coldwell said Mr. Lunam's reputation in Regina in the mid-1930s made him wonder that he could be considered a competent contractor. Mr. Diefenbaker called him a "fly-by-night" operator.

Mr. Drew and Mr. Diefenbaker contended that the government has an obligation to sub-contractors who placed their faith in the Lunam contracts because they involved the government.

**Four Vacancies**  
Mr. Dewar's resignation raised to four the number of Commons vacancies and cut Liberal membership to 183 in a 262-seat House. There are 48 Progressive Conservatives, 13 CCF, 10 Social Credit, one Independent Liberal and four independents.

The resignation was the first of its kind since 1932 when the late George Burpee Jones, a former Conservative cabinet minister, resigned when his New Brunswick firm was accused of selling goods to the Indians who are wards of the government. He was re-elected in a by-election and later appointed a senator.

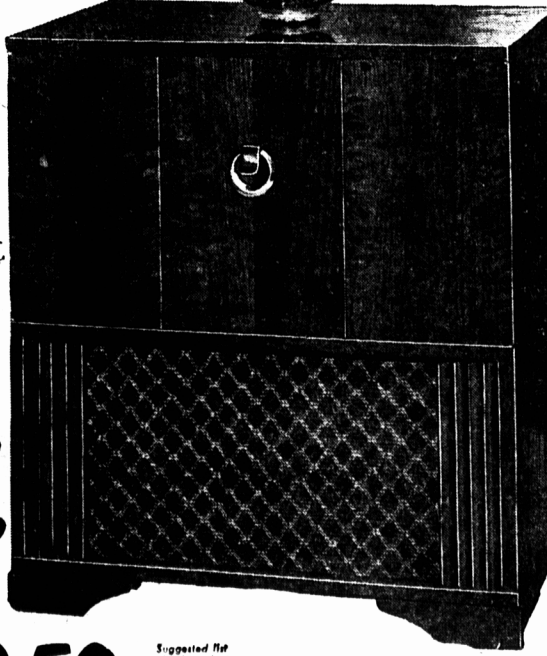
