

U.S. Vice-President In Bid To End Nuclear Arms Spread

NEW YORK (CP)—Vice-President Hubert Humphrey of the United States has called for joint partnership action by the Atlantic alliance nations to avert the spread of nuclear weapons to countries which do not have them now.

"There will be no security for any of our countries if the security to let loose these weapons proliferates," Humphrey

told the 11th annual NATO Parliamentarians' Conference. The vice-president appealed for agreement on some kind of arrangement to "offer our European partners an effective alternative to national systems of deterrents."

Humphrey did not specifically ask support of the delegations from the 18 NATO nations for the U.S.-proposed multilateral nuclear fleet, a project designed

primarily to give West Germany a voice in nuclear strategy and in decisions on the issues of nuclear warfare.

NATURAL WISH

He said that it is natural that European countries, with new strength and confidence, should wish to play a larger role in their own defence.

France is one of the NATO countries seeking a better sharing of nuclear responsibility and President de Gaulle has even threatened to quit NATO when the present agreement runs out in 1969 if something isn't done about revamping the NATO structure.

The United States is ready to join with the European NATO members in trying to work out arrangements under which the European nations can play a bigger part in their own defence, Humphrey said.

The vice-president said the NATO countries must also "consider how best to meet the concerns of key non-nuclear countries outside the Atlantic area—concerns which might otherwise move these countries to consider national deterrence."

PROMISE SUPPORT

Humphrey referred to President Johnson's statement last October on the first Chinese nuclear explosion when the pres-

ident said "no nation that does not seek nuclear weapons can be sure that if they need our support against some threat of nuclear blackmail, then they will have it." Then Humphrey added:

"I hope that interested Atlantic nations can work together in the United Nations, in disarmament negotiations, and elsewhere in seeking ways to fulfill this pledge."

In seeking to reduce armaments, as in other areas of negotiation with the Soviet Union, said Humphrey, Western unity will be essential if there is to be any chance of success.

Chinese Down American Plane

TOKYO (AP)—Communist Chinese air force planes shot down a U.S. fighter plane over the Chinese mainland Tuesday, Peking radio claimed.

The Chinese language broadcast said the plane was one of four American aircraft that intruded over the mainland. It said the intrusion was into Kwangsi province in southeast China at 12:28 p.m.

Chinese planes intercepted the aircraft and downed one, the broadcast said.

Stephenville U.S. Air Base Near Shutdown

HALEFAX (CP)—Mayor J. Alex Gillis of Stephenville, Nfld., said here the U.S. Air Force base near his city "appears more than ever to be nearing a shutdown point." He told the annual meeting of the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council no definite word from authorities on the situation.

But he appealed for APEC assistance to protect the investment the base had placed in his city.

Mr. Gillis said there had been constant rumors the base would close for several years, but said there had been firmer indications recently that a decision to close the base was near.

He said planes at the base used to re-fuel U.S. B-52 bombers in mid-air apparently had been withdrawn, and these "are the main reason for the base."

in the United States, but need refueling in mid-air to return home after missions abroad.

"The air force has put about \$250,000,000 into our area. Everything is there," including port, rail and air facilities.

"It would be a terrible thing if all this was to go to waste... if the base is closed, immediate action should be taken to develop the area again."

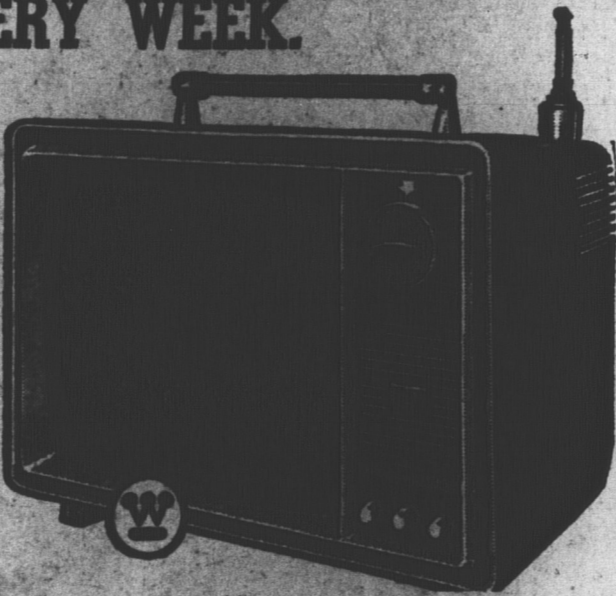

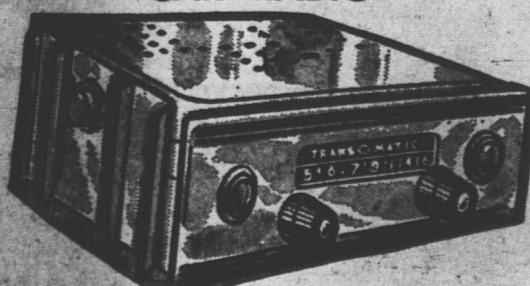

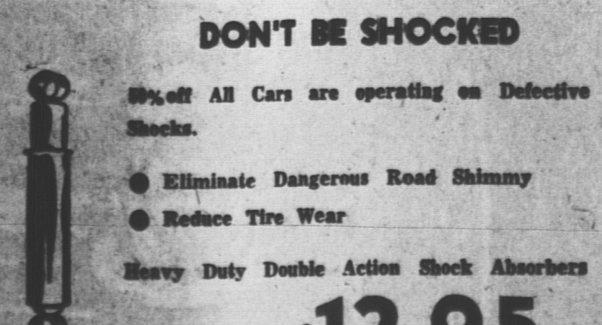
