Charter Presented S'side R.C.A.F. Association

Mr. Roy C. MacDonald, vice president of the Maritime Group R.C.A.F. Association, last night presented their charter to the newly formed Summerside Wing to Mr. Gregory Mulholland, president of the local group. The presentation was made at a largely attended meeting of the members held at the Olympia Restaurant. President Mulholland presided and outlined the work that had been done since the first organization meeting up to the present and said that the Association was formed primarily to bring together once again all the members of the air force who had served together during the war years. "We now have 63 members," he continued, "and if all do their part we can make this one of the best Wings in Canada. It is a privilege to be granted this charter for they are not handed out lightly."

Mr. MacDonald in presenting the charter said that this was the first Wing to be formed in Prince Edward Island. "There is an opening and a need for such an association," he stated, "and you should have one main objective. I am pleased to know that yours is the sponsorship of the air cadets in this community. There you have something to work for, something in which you can put your efforts in a common enterprise. I hope you will prosper and grow and on behalf of the Dominion Council I wish to present to you this charter and may it ever be a reminder to you of the sense of duty you owe to our great Dominion."

Mr. MacDonald was extended a civic welcome by His Worship Mayor Henry W. Wedge, who congratulated the members on the formation of the Wing and said he felt it would be instrumental in promoting good fellowship. In the absence of Group Captain Richards, who was unavoidably absent, Wing Commander D. A. Willis said that he had been asked by Group Captain Richards to assure the Wing of his personal support and that of the airport personnel in any undertaking they might engage in. Mr. J. E. Dalton, vice president of the civilian air cadet committee in transferring over the responsibilities and charter of his committee to the new Wing for their sponsorship of the cadets and expressed confidence that it would carry on the work it had undertaken with great success.—5.
