If the flock had not been shot off their resting ground they'd have hung out on this lake until freeze-up or until heavy snowfall covered the stubble too deep for feeding. This may be considered as unwitting conservation as they are

ous on salt water where they are safe as long as they stay there. It left at the lake a portion of the flock would have ended up in roasting pans. It takes time, patience and planning to bring Canada geese to bag. There are no short cuts although many hunters are on an easy "quackie" and deprive themselves of hunting that might last for weeks. In reality a lot of nimrods are not hunters but unwitting friends of the birds. May this type of hunter never grow less.

**Hunter's Corner**

The opening morning will shoot more ducks than forty on the same marsh together. "Why?" do I hear someone ask. When hunters line a duck lake or pot-hole less than 50 yards apart there is always someone standing up or roaming around at the wrong time or one of the group will fire at anything that shows on the horizon even if the ducks that are headed in look about as big as English sparrows. The very volume of gunners defeat the purpose for which they went out hunting.

A lot of them do not have to be young and inexperienced to pull unexcusable boners. Many never seem to be able to judge distance or learn to keep still and well hidden when birds are circling and looking the lay-out over before coming in for a landing. Some consider all they have to do is sit on their hunkers against a bush that doesn't reach to their shoulder blades and the big black ducks will zoom in like they didn't have a brain in their heads. Wrong hunting methods do a lot toward educating ducks and geese and cutting down on the kill.

Here is a case in point: This fall a flock of 30 odd geese made their headquarters in a large fresh water lake. This lake is approximately a mile long and the same distance wide. The geese didn't bother to fly out to salt water to spend their leisure hours as they

made their home on this lake. One hour before sunset two car loads of hunters converged on the lake. Someone had a bright idea although not a new one. They'd plant a line of gunners along the shore up wind from the geese and then detail a member to fire a shot on their flank. Geese naturally rise into the wind and would have to run the gauntlet of hidden gunners. I happened to be in the vicinity when the opening shot was fired and watched the flock take

Last Saturday afternoon a half off. The hunters didn't know as much about geese on this lake as they thought. The flock made a circle over mid lake to gain altitude before crossing the shoreline. I listened to the burst of gunfire, 15 or more shots that rippled like fire crackers, and watched the
