Annual Diocesan C. W. L.
Convention Opened Last
Night At Summerside

The 28th annual convention of
the Catholic Women's League of
Prince Edward Island opened
with a dinner at Robson's Restaurant,
Summerside, last evening
and will continue today and
Wednesday with sessions held at
the Knights of Columbus Home
here. The dinner meeting was
addressed by Rt. Rev. Mgr. G. J.
MacLellan, V.G. and by the
national C. W. L. president, Miss
Isabel Hutton of Ottawa, both
of whom exhorted the women
present that, while not neglecting
their primary duties in the home
they should become more active
in public life.

The meeting was presided over
by the president of the Summerside
Sub-division, Mrs. Carroll
Delaney who extended a welcome
to all present especially the national
president. A civic welcome
was extended by His Worship
Mayor Henry Wedge who said
it was an honor for the Town to
have a group of women gathered
here in convention whose work is
for the glory of God and the
welfare of our country. He commended
the League for its wonderful
work in education and in
the field of charity.

Monsignor MacLellan advised
his listeners to develop a deeper
knowledge of the social responsibilities
of women which they
should undertake and yet not
diminish their functions in the
home. He said that some women
are called to the cloister to spend
their lives in prayer and in close
adoration of God but the great
majority are called to motherhood.
The Blessed Virgin gave
to motherhood the exalted position
it holds. There are many
causes today trying to subvert it
and you must seek to keep it
in that exalted position.

Discusses Education
He said that a mother's interest
must go with her children to
school to see that they get a
Christian education. He stressed
that there is a need for more and
more education and a need for
women who have higher education
and are versed in Catholic
Philosophy and who can speak
for the womanhood of the country.
He explained that while their
first duty is to the home they
also have duties beyond it and
they must combat immorality and
immorality in films, radio, books
and magazines. He also advised
them to engage in works of charity.

Miss Hutton expressed her
appreciation to the Mayor for his
welcome and said that for many
years she has heard of the
achievements of the League in
this Province which have been a
matter of edification to their sisters
in other Provinces.

She said: "Never in the history
of the church has the duty of
women in social and political life
been so clearly defined." She
then went on to quote from the
present Pope to the effect that
women must take part in public
life. She said that the Catholic
Women's League of Canada comprises
350 subdivisions in 37 dioceses
with a membership of 7,000.

The C. W. L. is non-partisan
and is outside and above all
political parties. She said that
the C. W. L. is "definitely citizenship
conscious and is aware that
democracy must be built on faith
in God and in man endowed with
intelligence and integrity." Miss
Hutton stated that "women's part
in the present day is vitally
important" and she quoted the
Holy Father as urging an active
and intelligent participation by
women in civic actions in the
present day.

She said: "We recognize that
women's place is primarily in the
home and their function is its
administration but we are called
upon to go into the civic arena
to protect the home." In her
concluding remarks she asked for
more members as the need is
great.

Introduced By Local President
Miss Hutton was introduced by
Provincial President, Mrs. James
Pendergast of Kensington who
said it was encouraging to see
so many present and she hoped
that when they returned home
they would put into practice
what they learned at the
convention.

Mrs. Frank Murray of Charlottetown,
executive secretary
gave a report on the activities of
the League during the past year.
She said that there are 32 subdivisions
with 1739 members. Two
new branches were organized at
Fort Augustus and Mount Ryan
Over \$22,000 was raised during
the year. She outlined the charitable
work done, the project of
girls' scholarships, work among
immigrants and the campaign in
favor of good literature.

Rev. Francis McQuaid of
Kinkora, Provincial Spiritual Director
and Rev. Joseph MacLeod
both spoke briefly. Thanks to the
speakers and to the Summerside
Sub-division were expressed by
Miss Iphigene Arsenault of
Charlottetown. During the dinner
the delegates were entertained
with piano music by Mrs. Roy
Abern. Mrs. Abern also rendered
two very effective vocal solos
and Mr. Abern played two violin
solos. Past Grand Knight Carroll
Delaney extended fraternal greetings
from the Knights of Columbus.—S.
