

### Defenders Give Support To Dancing

TORONTO (CP) — Dancing's defenders have rallied round. The defence came after the Salvation Army publication, the War Cry, attacked dancing as a source of dangerous intimacy among teen-agers in "this loose-living generation."

The official army publication said the experience of its officers with unmarried mothers shows that many "owe their condition to the intimacy of the dance, often aggravated by a drink taken at these affairs."

But Rev. W. G. Westlake, an Anglican minister trained in psychology who operates a non-denominational pastoral counselling service, commented Monday that he doubts whether dancing is ever the cause of personal troubles.

"In itself, dancing is not wrong but is good and healthy," Mr. Westlake said.

Harold Dean, assistant superintendent of Toronto Secondary Schools, said most schools sponsor Friday night dances, tea dances for charity and an annual formal. Dancing is "an accepted form of relaxation," he said.

"It's part of a school's job of teaching young people how to behave themselves properly. It's far better for a chap and a girl to go to a public place where they can be together than to go somewhere else."

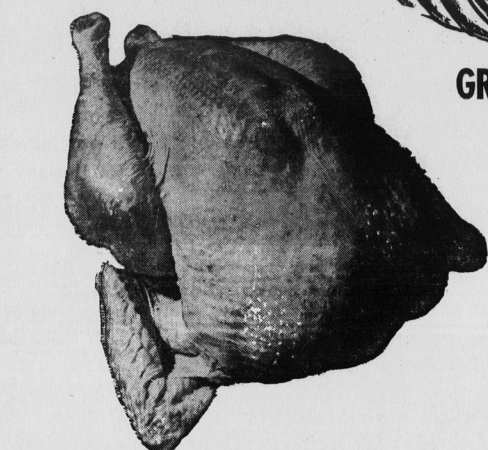
