## Local and Other Items.

**SCHOOLS CLOSED**—The public schools at Mainland, N.S., are closed on account of diphtheria.

**WHERE EGGS ARE SCARCE**—There is not an egg in town. The hens have apparently gone on a strike here as well as in New Brunswick.—Parrsboro Leader.

**ISLAND CATTLE**—Mr R. Innis brought over by the S S St. Olaf, from P. E. I. land, this week, another lot of cattle, numbering forty head.—Picton Advocate.

**CONCERNING CRANBERRIES**—Three hundred barrels of cranberries that were brought up from Sable Island to Halifax were sold in lots and were all eagerly bought up at from \$6 to \$6.10 a barrel.

**LIBRARIES NOT WANTED**—Evidently free libraries are not wanted in some parts of London. The three adjoining parishes of Islington, St. Pancras and Marylebone have refused to establish them even when the books were offered as a gift.

**DOESN'T LIKE FOOTBALL**—At the annual convention of the Association of American Agricultural Colleges and Experimental Stations, held at Washington last week President Ellis of Colorado scored the system of athletics in universities and characterized the football games as on a par with prize-fighting.

**A STRANGE ACCIDENT**—An ox belonging to Charles Coulson, of Sandville, broke loose from the stable on Saturday. In its wanderings it picked up an uncompleted string of apples with needles attached—which it swallowed. Fearing that such was the case Mr Coulson killed the beast and found the needles sticking through its intestines. It could not have lived more than a few hours longer.—Halifax Herald.

**FASHION'S CHANGES**—The rumor is abroad in Europe that the society man is to be emancipated from the trammels of sombre attire. In future, we are told, he is to adorn his dress suits with elaborately embroidered or gayly-colored revers, and thus put an end to the not infrequent fate of being taken for a waiter by indiscriminating fellow-guests at supper parties or exclusive functions. In Paris and London tailors are already building the new dress suits in considerable quantities.

**ANOTHER NEW STAMP**—As an exchange points out, Mr. Mulock must be a good friend of artists and engravers. On Christmas Day will be issued a new two-cent stamp, to commemorate the establishment of Imperial penny postage. The stamp will be usable for a limited period only, and to the following countries, Great Britain, Ireland, British India, Newfoundland, British East Africa, Uganda, Zanzibar, British Central Africa, the Niger Coast Protectorate, and the Niger Co.'s Territory. Mr Mulock has several designs under his consideration, all of them embodying the Imperial idea. These are brave days for philatelists.

**ALL ABOUT A GIRL**—Because they could not adjust their differences over a girl, a mere child, Martin Kilkeary and Jos Smith, two New York youths, became involved in a series of quarrels which ended in the deliberate murder of Smith. Smith was 21 years old, Kilkeary 18. The former, who had been paying attention to the girl, enlisted when the war broke out and Kilkeary supplanted him in the eyes of the fickle child. At the close of the war Smith wished to call back the old day; but Kilkeary grew threatening and when Smith sent a note to the girl asking her to accompany him to a dance Kilkeary vowed vengeance a few nights ago, when Kilkeary, accompanied by the girl, met Smith, fight followed and Kilkeary drew a revolver and shot Smith, the latter dying by the time he reached the hospital. Kilkeary and the girl have been arrested.

**A BRUTAL FATHER**—A terrible tale of brutality on the part of an inhuman father comes from Russell, N. Y., across the river from Cornwall, Ont. Orville Zeller lived about half a mile from Russell Village with his two motherless girls, aged respectively, 8 and 13 years. Recently passerby were shocked to hear cries and pleadings from the children and blows and curses from the enraged parent. Some of the neighbors went in and interfered, but as soon as they were out of hearing the brute again resumed his cruelty. Next morning the elder girl was unable to get out of bed, and then she was again pounded because she would not get up. As this had become a common occurrence, the authorities felt obliged to interfere, and notified Officer Rodds of Gouverneur, the agent of the society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, who took the children into custody. They were found to be badly bruised and scratched, and the older girl's face was cut with a whip.

## ESTEEMED EXCHANGES

Montreal Gazette; Reports from Ottawa indicate that Parliament will not be called together till next March. Some persist in thinking it will not be called in session till after a general election. There are many signs that the tide of opinion has turned against the Government, and the Ministers may be willing to risk the surety of two year and a half more for a chance of making it five, while there is yet a slim hope for them.
