Steel Output In U.S. Higher

CLEVELAND (AP) — Operations in the steel industry increased one point last week to 48 per cent of capacity. It halted a five - week decline. Steel magazine reports.

The industry's two largest districts showed modest upturns in production—Chicago was up two points to 55.5 per cent of capacity and Pittsburgh increased three points to 50 per cent.

St. Louis had the highest rate at 68.5 per cent while Detroit was the lowest at 12 per cent of capacity. Production was 1,296,000 net tons of steel for ingots and castings, an increase of 26,000 tons over the previous week.

An upturn in the second quarter was predicted by Avery C. Adams, president of Jones and Laughlin Steel Corporation. Second-quarter operations should average 55 per cent and increase to 75 per cent by the end of the year, Adams said.

But George M. Humphrey, National Steel Corporation's chairman, thinks operations in the second quarter will be slightly below the first quarter.

Scrap prices failed to react to the increased operations last week. Prime grades slipped to \$31.83 a gross ton, off \$1 from the previous week.

130 Teachers At Edmundston Resign Posts

EDMUNDSTON, N. B. (CP) — All 130 teachers in this city Tuesday tendered a mass resignation, effective at the end of the school year June 30, to bolster their demand for a salary increase.

"If no agreement is reached with the school board, city schools will be without teachers next fall," said Sister Marie De Ste. Henene, public relations director for the Edmundston branch of the New Brunswick Teachers' Association.
