Copies Received Of Oldtime Papers

In the realm of old newspapers two specimens, each almost 90 years old, were presented at the King's County Guardian office recently. Each is a copy of the "Weekly Visitor", one dated March 10, 1864, the other April 5, 1865.

"Devoted to the interest of the different temperance organizations the 'ex-ec' with subjects and articles regarding the drinking habit. However, it also branches in 'advice to young men' who are reproached severely for staying later than 10 p. m. at the home of their heart's choice. 'Dear gentlemen between the ages of 18 and 45, when you make a social call on a young lady, go away at a reasonable hour, say you came at eight o'clock, an hour and a half is certainly as long as the most fascinating of you in conversation can, or rather ought, to desire to use his charms'.

It continues "We were to be early, but when forced to be up at such unreasonable hours at night, exhausted nature must speak, and consequently we can barely get down to breakfast in time". No comment.

Another article deals with advice to young men starting out in business, showing them the difficulties to be encountered, and those things from which they must keep away. Saloons and theatres seemed to be the main pitfalls of young men almost 100 years ago, and every effort was made to dissuade young men from attending such iniquitous places.

A small pamphlet printed in 1877 contained dozens of Mrs. Winslow's domestic recipes for making puddings, pies, cakes, side dishes and relishes pickles and preserves.

A concluding advertisement has this to say about "Brown's Household Panacea", "the best remedy in the world for the following complaints: neuralgia, rheumatism, camp in legs and stomach, dysentery, fresh wounds, tooth ache, sore throat, sprains and bruises, pain in the side, bilious colic, cholera, colds, chapped hands, burns, spinal ailments, and chills and fever."

It is fortunate that the formula has been lost; such a medicine would cure practically all common ills today.
